Neighborhood Development Policy

Boston wants your input on a new Consolidated Plan. The Plan will identify key housing and community development needs and priorities to work on over the next 5 years. The Plan is part of the city’s comprehensive housing strategy, **Housing Boston 2030**, and will guide how we invest the \$24 million that DND expects to receive each year from these federal grant programs:

- **Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)**
- **HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME)**
- **Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG)**
- **Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA).**
