#### ORDERED:

I. #### Dear Councilors:

I retransmit herewith an appropriation order for the Boston Public Schools for Fiscal Year 2008, in the amount of \$782.5 million, submitted pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224 of the Acts of 1936, as amended by Chapter 190 of the Acts of 1982, as further amended by Chapter 701 of the Acts of 1986, Chapter 613 of the Acts of 1987, and Chapter 108 of the Acts of 1991.

This budget represents an increase of \$35 million over the FY2007 appropriation of \$747.5 million. Although much of this increase will fund collective bargaining increases and rising health insurance costs, the School Department is also investing in the expansion of proven strategies and the creation of new instructional initiatives that will help our students succeed.

The Boston Public Schools FY08 budget is designed to be a financial blueprint for the district's key educational priorities – most notably, closing the achievement gap by focusing on students, teachers, and families. The FY08 plan includes the creation of 10 Superintendent's schools, where the school day will be extended and additional resources will be targeted to improving the learning community and overall student performance. This budget supports the next step in expanding opportunities for 4 year-olds by providing an additional 450 K-1 seats across the city, bringing the district's total to 1,900. Investments in teachers as educators in the classroom are also expanded with the launch of a New Teacher Developer program and Peer Assistance program. The Family and Community Outreach Coordinator program nearly doubles in size in FY08, with the addition of 15 new positions including 14 new outreach coordinators.

The Boston Public Schools acknowledges the importance of addressing issues of student attendance and the rate at which students drop out of school. In order to address these issues successfully, a broad-based, long-term strategy is required. To that end, the Parthenon Group was commissioned to study overage/off-track youth in the City of Boston; the results of that study are expected to be released this summer. The FY08 resubmission includes funding of \$500,000 to establish a reserve for targeted resources pending the release of the study. This funding will be used to begin to form a long term strategy to address truancy, drop-outs and alternative education capacity and requirements.



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The School Department remains committed to improving student achievement through focused classroom support, innovative programming, and dedicated investments in teachers, students, their families and their communities.

I respectfully request your support of the FY08 appropriation for the Boston Public Schools.

#### Dear Councilors:

I transmit herewith for your approval an order authorizing the creation of a stabilization fund under MGL Chapter 40, §5B for other post employment benefits (OPEB). Other post employment benefits include the cost of healthcare and life insurance benefits provided to eligible City of Boston retirees and their dependents.

The City is required to implement new standards for financial statements established by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB), whereby state and local governments must now identify and disclose the future estimate of non-pension benefits obligated to be paid on behalf of current and future retirees.

The City's OPEB total obligation has been estimated at \$5.2 billion by an outside actuarial consultant. The FY08 Budget takes a first step in acknowledging this real, yet unfunded cost of providing health insurance to retirees by allocating \$20 million in reserves to a stabilization fund set up specifically for this purpose.

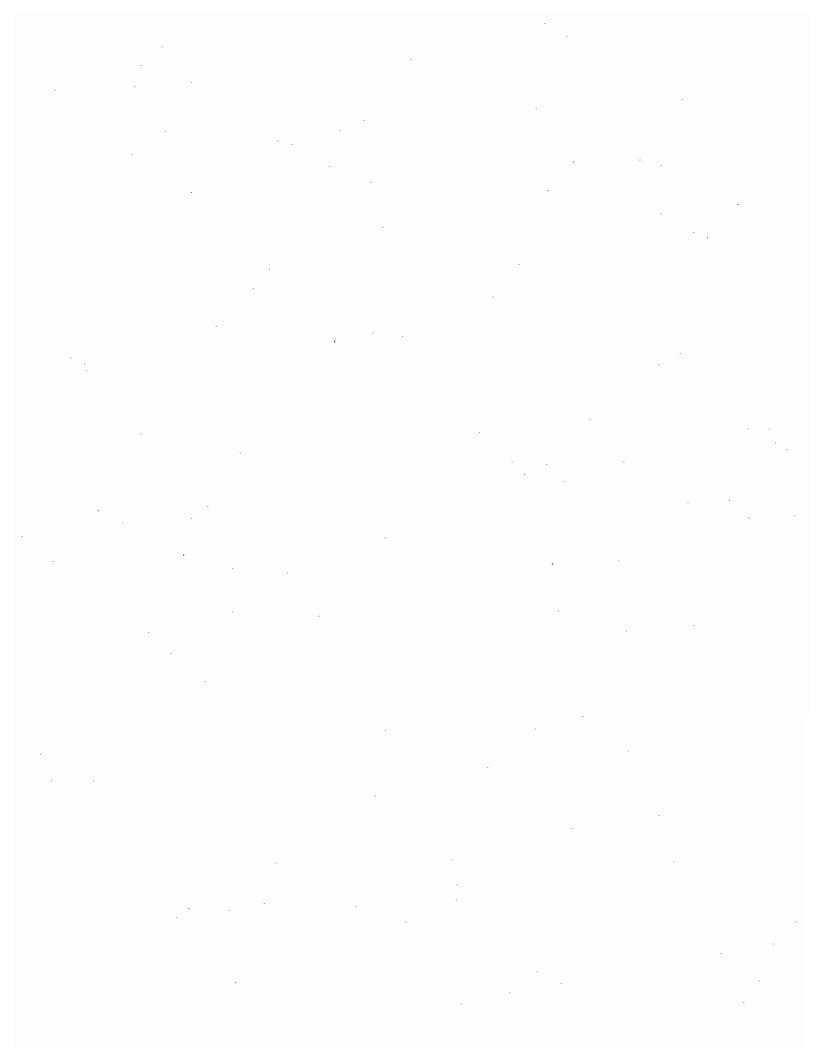

#### Dear Councilors:

I transmit herewith for your approval an order authorizing the City of Boston to enter into one or more lease, lease-purchase or installment sales agreements in Fiscal Year 2008 in an amount not to exceed \$7,700,000, and in Fiscal Year 2009 in an amount not to exceed \$23,400,000. These funds are to be used by various City departments for the acquisition of equipment in furtherance of their respective governmental functions. The list of equipment includes: computer equipment (hardware and software), motor vehicles and trailers, firefighting equipment, office equipment, photocopying equipment, telecommunications equipment, medical equipment, school and educational equipment, school buses, parking meters, street lighting installation, traffic signal equipment and equipment functionally related to, and components of, the foregoing.

The Fiscal Year 2008 authorization is in addition to the amount of \$15,700,000 authorized by the Council on June 28, 2006. This increased authorization is necessary to accommodate the School Department's computer replacement plan.

I urge your Honorable Body to pass this order as expeditiously as possible to ensure the successful completion of the equipment acquisition program.

**AND FURTHER ORDERED:** That pursuant to section 9 of Chapter 643 of the Acts of 1983, the Collector-Treasurer be, and hereby is, authorized to execute and deliver, as appropriate, on behalf of the City of Boston, with the approval of the Mayor, trust, security and/or lease agreements and/or reimbursement agreements with attached letters of credit, and to procure, as appropriate, insurance to secure the City's obligation as authorized above, all in such form or forms as the Collector/Treasurer may determine with the approval of the Mayor.
