

Boston PILOT Assessment Summary

Tufts University - Calendar Year 2017

This report responds to the City of Boston's inquiry about services provided to residents by tax exempt institutions.

Process Summary

Community Relations collected data on activities, programs, volunteer efforts, and services that Tufts students, faculty, and staff have provided to benefit the City of Boston and/or its residents. For the purpose of this survey, we concentrated on activities that occurred during calendar year 2017. This includes financial aid. The total is \$11,542,413.76

We solicited information from each of our schools. The data outlined on the following pages represents the results collected. Please note that we did not put a dollar value on the use of space on campus even though many other organizations were charged a rental fee. Also, this report does not include salaries paid to residents of the City of Boston (560 employees; \$39 million).
