WHEREAS: *Immigrants enrich our culture, increase our productivity and innovation, and bolster our economy; AND*

WHEREAS: *Municipal leaders in cities and towns across Massachusetts foster welcoming and safe communities for all their residents, regardless of who they are or where they come from; AND*

WHEREAS: *Municipal officials across America have called on the federal government to enact comprehensive immigration reform and enforce the nation's immigration laws in a humane manner that does not disrupt the lives of residents. In the absence of federal immigration reform, cities and towns seek to work together to pursue strategies that protect and secure all their residents while ensuring that local law enforcement is focused on community policing; AND*

WHEREAS: *The City of Boston is hosting the Municipal Leaders for Immigrant Advancement Summit on June 29, 2017 led by Mayor Martin J. Walsh to honor the vast contributions of immigrants to our communities and to recommit our municipalities to the protection and wellbeing of all residents; AND*




