ORDER FOR A HEARING REGARDING THE CITY OF BOSTON PURCHASING LIQUOR LICENSES

WHEREAS: Governor Baker ordered restaurants and bars in the Commonwealth to cease on-site consumption as of March 17, 2020 as a result of the Covid-19 outbreak; and

WHEREAS: The Massachusetts Restaurant Association estimates that up to 40% of restaurants may not reopen once the current State of Emergency ends; and

WHEREAS: Up to 90% of restaurant workers in the Commonwealth have been furloughed or laid

off as a result of the closures; and

WHEREAS: Bars and restaurants are integral to the fabric of our City's neighborhoods and economy and will be a key component of the economic recovery after Covid-19; and

WHEREAS: Many restaurants are in need of immediate funds that would allow them to reopen when they are able to do so; and

WHEREAS: Some restaurant and bar operators have an asset in the form of a transferable liquor license; and

WHEREAS: The current system of transferring liquor licenses requires a needs-based assessment of a license in a particular location even if an establishment is already operating at that address; and

WHEREAS: The City's current distribution of liquor licenses is inequitable, with neighborhoods in the City that are underserved by bars and restaurants and a geographic concentration of liquor licenses; and

WHEREAS: The existing liquor license distribution exacerbates wealth inequality in the City of Boston, allowing license holders to better overcome financial hardships due to the Covid-19 pandemic;

WHEREAS:

The Covid-19 pandemic provides a unique opportunity for the City of Boston to invest in our local economy by owning newly available licenses and redistributing them in a more equitable manner; THEREFORE

BE IT ORDERED.

That the appropriate committee of the Boston City Council holds a hearing to discuss a City buyback of certain liquor licenses, the leasing of these licenses back to the operators, the conversion of these licenses from transferable to non-transferable, the attachment of these non-transferable licenses to the address in which the establishment is currently located, and that members of the City of Boston Licensing Board and other interested parties be invited to testify.
