The Board reserves the right to amend this hearing notice prior to the emergency hearing as necessary to reflect any Licensees observed in violation of COVID-19 operational requirements.

Attendance at the virtual emergency licensed premise inspection hearing is mandatory. Failure of the Licensee to appear at the virtual emergency licensed premise inspection hearing will result in disciplinary action by the Board including, but not limited to, the suspension or revocation of any license issued by the Board.
