I hereby transmit for your approval an Order authorizing the City of Boston to accept and expend the amount of THREE MILLION TWO HUNDRED FORTY-EIGHT THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED TWENTY DOLLARS (\$3,248,220.00) in the form of a grant, Federal FY21 Housing For Persons with AIDS (HOPWA), awarded by the United States Department of Housing & Urban Development to be administered by the Neighborhood Development.

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Housing & Urban Development, is being petitioned for the issuance of funds to the Neighborhood Development; and

WHEREAS, the funds in the amount of THREE MILLION TWO HUNDRED FORTY-EIGHT THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED TWENTY DOLLARS (\$3,248,220.00) would fund rental assistance and services for Persons with HIV/AIDS. Therefore be it

ORDERED: that the Mayor, acting on behalf of the City of Boston be, and hereby is authorized, pursuant to section 53A of chapter 44 of the Massachusetts General Laws, to accept and expend the the United States Department of Housing & Urban Development, Federal FY21 Housing For Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) award not to exceed the amount of THREE MILLION TWO HUNDRED FORTY-EIGHT THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED TWENTY DOLLARS (\$3,248,220.00).
