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
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


PROJECT SCOPE

- Review existing conditions and use of the playground, pathways and parking lots
- Identify new playground elements reflective of the community
- Upgrade playground equipment, safety surfacing and access
- Assess feasibility of new restroom building
- Replace or repair damaged pathways or parking on-going process



KEY FEATURES -

AREA A - 2-5, PLAY HOUSE WITH CLIMBING AND SLIDES, SMALL CLIMBER AND NESTS

AREA B - SWINGS AND BALANCING/CLIMBING **ELEMENTS**

AREA C - 5-12, LARGE STRUCTURE WITH HILL SLIDES

AREA D - 5-12, LARGE CLIMBING STRUCTURE WITH AREA D - SWINGS AND ZIPLINE **VIEW**

KEY FEATURES -

AREA A - 2-5, PLAY WITH SMALL EMBANKMENT SLIDE, NEST, AND PLAYHOUSE

AREA B - BALANCING AND SPINNING PLAY **ELEMENTS**

AREA C - 5-12, LARGE CLIMBER ROPE STRUCTURE WITH SLIDE AND BRIDGES

KEY FEATURES -

AREA A - 2-5, PLAYHOUSE WITH SLIDE, DISH SWING, BALANCING ELEMENTS AND RIVER **CREATURES**

AREA B - INCLUSIVE SPINNING ELEMENTS, OBSTACLE CLIMBING ELEMENTS, AND SWINGS **AREA C -** 5-12, OVERLOOK TOWER STRUCTURE (ACCESSIBLE FROM BOTH TOP AND BOTTOM) WITH SLIDES AND VIEW

COMMUNITY MEETING #2 WHAT WE HEARD

General Comments

- Swings are a crucial play item, dish swing would be great too
- Include large climbing structures and net systems
- Include accessible playground equipment for all ages
- Bird and nature theme received positive comments
- A combination of natural seating and more formal seating with shading is desired
- Add in more native vegetation to provide shade and wind protection, without obstructing the views
- Include a teen seating area
- Fencing and natural barriers should be used in some instances to help protect and enclose certain play areas



COMMUNITY MEETING #2 WHAT WE HEARD

Comments and preferred elements for the 2-5 year-old play areas:

- Locate the play area further away from the parking lot, consider enclosure
- Include embankment slide with climbing options
- Include creative play playhouse, wildlife

Comments and preferred elements for the 5-12 year-old play areas:


- Include treehouse play structure
- Large slide
- Skywalk tower with bridge
- Rope climbing net structure; obstacle play
- Accessible
- Slope play was a concern for visibility
- Zipline














