

PROJECT CHARTER



State Street is one of Boston's oldest and most iconic streets. Its current configuration makes for a disjointed experience for pedestrians and motorists.

This project is an opportunity to apply a 'People First' approach to the design of State Street. The new design will provide a more balanced experience for all road users by offering safety, mobility, and overall functionality improvements for this corridor.

STATE STREET CONTEXT: Go Boston 2030




Sets goals, targets and an action plan for Boston's transportation system. Aspirational targets address:

- Improving Safety Eliminate fatalities and severe injuries
- Expanding Access 10-minute walk to transit, bike/car share
- Ensuring Reliability Reduce average commute by 10 percent
- Reducing Car Use See below
- Reducing Emissions Carbon neutral by 2050
- Increasing Affordability Reduce transportation costs for low-income households

2030 Targets for Commute Mode Shift:

Transit	34%		by one-third
Walk	14%	1	by one-half
Bike	2%	1	by fourfold
Drive Alone	39%	•	by half
Carpool	6%	•	marginally
Telecommute	5%	1	marginally

STATE STREET CONTEXT: Boston Vision Zero



Provides an action plan to eliminate fatal and serious injuries from traffic crashes.

"Human life takes priority over mobility and other objectives of the road system. The street system will be safe for all users, for all modes of transportation, in all communities, and for people of all ages and abilities."













EXISTING CONDITIONS: Sidewalk Condition

CURB REGULATIONS & COMMERCIAL VEHICLE PARKING RESTRICTIONS




COMMERCIAL VEHICLE PARKING RESTRICTIONS

- 1. Commercial Vehicles Only 7 AM 7 PM (Except Sundays) (30-minute time limit)
- 2. Commercial Vehicles Only 7 AM 6 PM (Except Saturdays & Sundays) (30-minute time limit)
- 3. Commercial Vehicles Only 8 AM 6 PM (Except Saturdays & Sundays) (30-minute time limit)
- 4. Commercial Vehicles Only 7 AM 10 AM / Tour Bus Only 10 AM 6 PM
- 5. Commercial Vehicles Only 7 AM 11 AM / 2 Hr. 11 AM 8 PM (Except Sundays)

Note: A curbside use study has been conducted for the area and will be discussed at a future meeting.


EXISTING CONDITIONS: Injury Crashes – 5 Years

- 3 crashes involving motor vehicles only




EXISTING CONDITIONS: Section @ Pinch Point




EXISTING CONDITIONS: Section @ Congress Street



TRANSPORTATION CHARACTERISTICS: Vehicular Volumes




TRANSPORTATION CHARACTERISTICS: Pedestrian Volumes






TRANSPORTATION CHARACTERISTICS: Bicycle Volumes





TRANSPORTATION CHARACTERISTICS: Weekday MBTA Entries





TYPICAL WEEKDAY STATION ENTRIES













PUBLIC INPUT: Online Survey - Over 1,100 Responses









How do you travel along State Street (check all that apply)?
