**PUBLIC HEARING
BOSTON AIR POLLUTION CONTROL COMMISSION
January 25, 2023**

In accordance with the Procedures and Criteria for the Issuance of Parking Freeze Permits adopted under M.G.L. Chapter 111, Section 31C, and pursuant to the Building Emissions Reduction and Disclosure Ordinance, Boston City Code, Ordinances, Section 7-2.2, the City of Boston Air Pollution Control Commission will hold a **virtual public hearing at 1:00 p.m. on January 25, 2023**, to review the following projects to regulate and control air pollution so as to promote the public health and welfare of Boston residents.

Any matter posted as part of a public hearing may be deliberated on at a subsequent meeting.

PUBLIC HEARING:

Discussion and vote on the proposed Phase 2b draft revisions to the regulations for the Building Emissions Reduction and Disclosure Ordinance. The Phase 2b regulations cover topics including emissions factors, renewable energy purchases, and other clarifying regulations as needed.

Application for a Modified South Boston Parking Freeze Permit from Bayberry Management on behalf of the Court Square Press Condominium Trust for 7 commercial spaces, 22 residential included spaces and 269 residential excluded spaces. This permit is to add 12 residential excluded spaces and 7 commercial spaces to the facility's parking freeze permit. Issuance of the permit would withdraw 19 spaces from the South Boston parking freeze bank.

Application for a Modified East Boston Parking Freeze Permit from VHB on behalf of Cargo Ventures LLC for 575 park and fly spaces. This permit is to relocate spaces from a surface lot at 320 McClellan Highway to a new parking garage at 440 McClellan Highway. Modification of the permit would have no effect on the East Boston parking freeze bank. **Continued to an upcoming meeting*

Application for a Modified East Boston Parking Freeze Permit from VHB on behalf of Cargo Ventures LLC for 127 park and fly spaces. This permit is to relocate spaces from a surface lot at 380 McClellan Highway to a new parking garage at 440 McClellan Highway. Modification of the permit would have no effect on the East Boston parking freeze bank. **Continued to an upcoming meeting*

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COMMISSION MEETING:

Update and discussion on Building Emissions Reduction and Disclosure Ordinance implementation.

Revocation of Downtown Parking Freeze Exemption Certification APCC453797 (Historic Permit No. 35.00) located at 34 Cooper Street, permitted for 67 exempt spaces. The facility has failed to renew its parking freeze exemption certification, which expired on July 1, 2021, due to a failure to document how members of the general public are excluded from parking at the facility and operation of unpermitted commercial parking spaces. **Continued from the December 14, 2022 meeting*

Revocation of South Boston Parking Freeze Permit APCC367693 (Historic Permit No. 27.00) located at 9 West Broadway, permitted for 10 commercial spaces. The facility has failed to renew its parking freeze permit, which expired on July 1, 2021, due to inconsistencies reported in the renewal form. **Continued from the December 14, 2022 meeting*
