


Parking availability = (Number of spaces) x (Number of people who can use each space per day)

# **Parcels Summary**

- 30 city-owned parcels across the Blue Hill Ave Corridor (Mattapan, Dorchester, and Roxbury).
- Approximately 97,000 gross square feet.
- City Council Districts 4, 5, & 7: Councilor Worrell
   (D4), Councilor Arroyo (D5), and Councilor Fernandes
   Anderson (D7).
- Zoning includes: Multi-family Residential (MFR), Local Services (LS), Local Convenience (LC), Neighborhood Shopping (NS), 3F-4000, 3F-5000 and 3F-6000.
- Previous efforts to develop the sites include RFP(s) issued in 2016-2017 for mixed-use/commercial development.



# **Project Timeline**

#### **Winter 2019**

MOH met with BPDA, OED, BTD, and Councilor Campbell's office to outline the Blue Hill Avenue Action Plan and provide context for MOH's upcoming community meetings. MOH participated in Plan: Mattapan Deep Dive community meetings and BTD Transportation Action Plan discussions.

#### Fall-Winter 2020

Continued hosting virtual meetings and walking tours for remaining parcel groups. We worked with elected officials, OED, BPDA and local leaders to draft the B1 Parcels RFP.

#### Spring-Summer 2022

Issued the 2nd RFP under the action plan for 18 parcels (B3 & B4 parcels). Proposals due July 26, 2022, no later than 4:00 PM. MOH received proposals from 5 development teams for 12 of the 18 parcels.

#### Spring-Summer 2020

MOH held walking tours, conducted surveys, and hosted community meetings & discussions centered around possible uses. We collect feedback and requirements to help shape the forthcoming RFPs.

#### Spring 2021

Issued an RFP for 10 parcels (B1 parcels). Proposals were due in August 2021. MOH received 6 proposals to develop the sites. 2 development teams were tentatively selected to develop 8 of the 10 parcels in this package.

#### Fall-Winter 2022

MOH presented eligible proposals at a virtual community meeting on 9/27/22. Public Comment period ended on 10/14/22. MOH will complete the evaluation and make developer recommendations in January 2023.



### Welcome Home, Boston: Overview

- The City of Boston is launching a new initiative to help low to moderate income Bostonians become homeowners
  - First-time homebuyer assistance
  - Constructing homeownership on city-owned lots
- Mayor Wu has allocated \$58M in time-limited Federal
   ARPA Funds to support the Initiative



# **Leveraging City-Owned Land**



- MOH has identified approximately 150 parcels of City-owned land suitable for homeownership development
- In Fall 2022, MOH began engaging about the development of ~70 parcels in Dorchester and Mattapan
- 20 parcels in Roxbury and Dorchester to be included in the first RFP package (released March 2023)



# **Development Guidelines**

Based on community feedback, MOH plans to ask respondents to:

- Maximize use of public land available to create affordable
   homeownership opportunities for low- to moderate-income homebuyers
- Focus on providing family-sized units (2BR+)
- Provide complementary open space where feasible
- Provide parking appropriate to the site context and access to transit

- Housing affordability: Large-scale public investments can impact the cost of housing. We are working together to proactively address concerns of gentrification and displacement along Blue Hill Avenue.




