



# FORT POINT CHANNEL LANDMARK DISTRICT COMMISSION PUBLIC HEARING MINUTES

Held virtually via Zoom

# March 9, 2023

There were no members of the press present.

**6:03 PM:** Chair D. Berarducci called the public hearing to order. She explained that, pursuant to the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Executive Order Suspending Certain Provisions of the Open Meeting Law, that the public hearing was being conducted via the online meeting platform Zoom in order to review Design Review applications. She also briefly explained how to participate in this online hearing. She then called the design review hearing to order.

#### I. DESIGN REVIEW HEARING

ADDRESS: 25 Thomson Place

Applicant: Nate Turner

Proposed Work: Replace existing transom glazing with louvers for mechanical

equipment.

**Project Representatives:** Nate Turner the project representatives.

**Documents Presented:** Photos of existing conditions and plans of the proposed work.

**Discussion Topics:** Commissioners discussed the existing windows, what was there before, the intake and exhaust louvers, the profile and size of the louvers, any







alternatives for the louvers and their locations, their desire to see more context of the street, if there was a way to minimize the number of louver vents.

**Public Comment:** Joshua Johnson was curious about other exhaust options like at Bar Taco or Dig. Sara McCammond was concerned about other entrances.

T. Rodde made a motion to continue the application. J. Karoff seconded the motion. The vote was 4-0 (Y: JK, TR, SG, DB) (N: None) (Abs: None)

- Would like to see a streetscape view of Stillings Street

**Discussion Topics:** Commissioners discussed the size of the signs on both sides of the street as well as the main entryway.

**Public Comment:** Sara McCammond asked about which door was the main entryway and Joshua Johnson asked for an explanation about the Stillings Street slides.


T. Rodde motioned to approve the application with provisos. S. Goganian seconded the motion. The vote was 4-0 (Y: DB, JK, TR, SG) (N: None) (Abs: None) Provisos were as follows:

 Thomson Place Signage should mimic Stillings Street signage and the scale of the name of the resturant should be larger than the other signage.

Proposed work: Install signage and wayfinding graphics.

**Documents Presented:** Photos of existing conditions and plans of the proposed work.

**Discussion Topics:** Commissioners discussed how the project had scaled down significantly since the applicant's last appearance; they also discussed the banners – their size and scale as well as color and how they would be installed and the proposed lighting fixtures.

**Public Comment:** Tom Ready noted that he appreciated what the applicant was doing, discussed the concept of streets vs. the neighborhood, discussed the banners and their size, the proposed wall art and appreciated the wayfinding graphics. Sara McCammond reiterated what Tom said and also stated that she doesn't want this to create precedence for branding streets, asked some specific questions on the wall art wraps, and asked about what would happen with the existing Bar Taco logo.

T. Rodde motioned to approve the application with provisos. S. Goganian seconded the motion. The vote was 4-0 (Y: DB, JK, TR, SG) (N: None) (Abs: None) Provisos were as follows:

- Mock-up of proposed sign lighting on the face of the building to see how it looks from the ground - confirming that we will not see a hot-spot and that the beam of light will go all the way down the length of the signs.
- Return to the Commission with more details on the banners including: variations in banner color schemes; a reduction in their scale (removing the lower level where the tenant name is and shortening the banner); adding in the text "Fort Point;" as well as renderings showing how they will look along the street.
- Please include scaled drawings of all proposed signage with dimensions, installation details and locations.



  - The housing of the heaters must be painted to match the horizontal beams above.

Applicant: Matthew Wessling


Proposed work: Install new through-wall flashings after removal of displaced brick atop existing cast iron channels that will be removed and replaced. See additional items under administrative review.

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**Discussion Topics:** Commissioners discussed the removal of the brick and what type would be used to replace and the painting of the new metal.



- -Sensor pads be red in color vs. the yellow.
- Bike rack material is a raw galvanized metal
- Finally, a Continuance regarding the tree planting: applicant must return to the Commission with a tree planting detail as well as an explanation of the existing and proposed tree species as well as the proposed tree pits.
