AN ORDER AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF BOSTON TO ACCEPT AND EXPEND FY22 Fire Prevention and Safety Grant Program (FP&S) FUNDS, AWARDED BY Federal Emergency Management Agency.

WHEREAS, the Federal Emergency Management Agency, is being petitioned for the issuance of funds to the Fire Department; and

WHEREAS, the funds in the amount of FORTY-SEVEN THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED NINETY DOLLARS AND FORTY-SEVEN CENTS (**\$47,890.47**) would fund the purchase of an evidence management system and necessary supporting items and provide one-time training to personnel of the Fire Investigation Unit on the use of the system.
