













RECENT TIMELINE OF THE SITE

1980 - 2000



- There is a garage and laundromat on the site.
- There are a few buildings on the Mecca \bullet site along Blue Hill ave and Geneva ave.

2000 - 2010



- By the early 2000s, the City had acquired the site. The buildings on site are demolished in 2002
- For a short time, "the bubble" was located on \bullet the site
- Grove Hall Mecca Development begins taking shape



- Site is vacant and used for parking
- Oldfields Road extension from Normandy \bullet completed with no connection to Columbia Road
- Grove Hall Mecca development complete \bullet with grocery store, drug store, and local businesses






GROVE HALL CATCHMENT AREA

The 48 Geneva Avenue catchment area is determined by proximity to surrounding BCYF community centers



TRANSIT CATCHMENT AREA


The larger transportation catchment area is influenced by frequent bus routes (~20' intervals or less on weekdays) that pass within walking distance of the site. The catchment area extends to include bus stops within a 20 minute ride to the site, and a 5 minute walk radius around the stops. The included routes are the 16, 19, 22, 23, 28, and 45 lines. Additional bus routes run through the area, but at a decreased frequency.



LOCAL COMMUNITY CENTERS

There are several existing BCYF locations and other community and recreation centers within a 20 minute walk of the site.




