## BAY STATE ROAD/BACK BAY WEST AREA ARCHITECTURAL CONSERVATION DISTRICT COMMISSION PUBLIC HEARING MINUTES

Held virtually via Zoom

# March 8, 2022

**5:00 PM:** Commissioner Beale called the public hearing to order. She explained that, pursuant to the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Executive Order Suspending Certain Provisions of the Open Meeting Law, that the public hearing was being conducted virtually via the online meeting platform Zoom in order to review Design Review applications. **22.0871 BSR <u>190 Bay State Road:</u> Replace existing light pole and install DAS node.** 

Project Representative: Kennan Brinn.

**Documents Presented:** The Commissioners reviewed a presentation consisting of details, plans, and photos of the existing conditions.

**Discussion Topics:** Commissioners discussed the fact that the proposed DAS node is different from those previously approved by the Commission on Bay State Road, specifically in that instead of a base for equipment, equipment is mounted on the shaft of the pole.

• The DAS node must have a cabinet base instead of equipment mounted to the shaft to maintain consistency on the street.
