BAY VILLAGE HISTORIC DISTRICT COMMISSION PUBLIC HEARING MINUTES

Held virtually via Zoom

February 14, 2023

4:00 PM: Chair K. McDermott called the public hearing to order. She explained that, pursuant to the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Executive Order Suspending Certain Provisions of the Open Meeting Law, that the public hearing was being conducted virtually via the online meeting platform Zoom in order to review Design Review applications. She also briefly explained how to participate in the online hearing. Following this brief introduction K. McDermott called the first agenda item.

I. Administrative Review/Approval Applications

23.0580 BV 6 Fayette Street: At front facade replace seven six-over-six wood windows with six-over-six simulated divided light windows.

Discussion Topics: Staff explained that proposed work is consistent with the Commission's guidelines, and discussed the difference between simulated divided-light and true-divided light windows.

Public Comment: There was no public comment.
