












### SCHEMATIC DESIGN FLOOR PLANS


#### **COMMUNITY AND EDUCATION**

#### **Eliminate Flexible Classroom**


- Other flexible and education focused spaces are provided within the building to host activities



#### **COMMUNITY ROOM OPTION 1**

# Reduce standalone Community Room and increase flexible use with Senior Center

- Enlarge Senior Center to provide more senior specific programming throughout the day
- Make Senior Center subdivisible for variety of programs
- Increase flexibility of Community Room to host large or simultaneous Senior Center events
- Allow Senior Center to function as overflow Community Room space for large events scheduled outside of senior center hours



- Community room eliminated
- Community Room programming potentially occurs across the street






### **INDOOR SPORTS AND FITNESS**

#### Eliminate Walking/Jogging Track

- Gym remains fully functional with high school regulation main court, subdivisible into two cross-courts
- Gym keeps larger dimensions during use as Emergency Shelter, Cooling Center
- Design Team will study alternate ideas for indoor walking: within the gym, corridors, etc.








#### **POOL**

#### **Eliminate Pool Viewing Area**


- View into pool from lobby remains
- Benches will be provided around perimeter of pool deck for viewing

# Eliminate 2 of 4 gender neutral restroom/ shower/ changing rooms

• 2 fully accessible gender neutral restroom/shower/changing rooms will remain

#### **Reduce Pool to 5 Lanes**


- Pool can still function as a competition pool
- Pool will be comparable to most other BCYF pools
- Zero entry ramp providing accessible entry to pool remains




### **OUTDOOR SPACE**

#### **Eliminate 2nd Floor Roof Deck**

- 3,200 SF Public Plaza will be provided at building entry
- Sidewalk improvements and street tree planting remains






