








PROJECT SCHEDULE
















CONCEPT 1 - UPDATE CURRENT DESIGN






CONCEPT 2 - RELOCATE ENTRANCES TO IMPROVE FLOW TO BAY VILLAGE COMMUNITY






CONCEPT 3 - CONNECTING ENTRANCES TO BAY VILLAGE










SITE MATERIALS - PAVING MATERIALS




Granite cobble border (Borders)



Granite accent paving (Entrances and at fountain area)



Wire struck brick pavers (ADA friendly - consistent thickness)






SITE MATERIALS - LIGHTING & FURNISHINGS



Existing gas lamps



Flexible seating by community



Steel strap trash and recycling receptacles Boston Parks standard



Black steel strap bench - with center arm rest



Bench with steel frame and recycled plastic slats



Bench with steel frame and ipe hardwood slats



SITE MATERIALS - FOUNTAINS & EDGES



Restore fountain



Include interactive jets



Provide signature drain



Add strong edge to plant bed (Detailed granite curb)



Provide steel lockable storage box (Existing box at Ringold Park shown)



Border guard if desired

Witch Hazel Late winter bloom






