Bike share today

- ► 500+ stations (280+ in Boston)
- 4500 bikes (2000 in Boston), including ~750 ebikes
- Publicly owned, operating in 13 municipalities
 - Lyft = operator
 - BCBS of MA = title sponsor
 - Municipalities = owners



Boston residents ride for less with the Boston Bikes Pass






- Long-time income-eligible pass options:
 - \$50/year or \$5/month
- New discounts for Boston residents launched in October 2023
 - \$5/year for income-eligible residents
 - \$60/year for new members
 (have not had an annual membership in the last three years)

Millions of trips taken


- been taken on Bluebikes just in Boston so far this year (and 4.2 million systemwide). This number increases each year as we expand our system.
- Almost 15% of those trips started in East Boston, Charlestown, South Boston, or South Boston Waterfront.


BOSTON BLUEBIKES STATIONS IN 2017




Analyzing the need in South Boston






As of August 2024, we had over 800 active members who live in South Boston or the Waterfront

Analyzing the need in South Boston



- In areas with the most jobs and population density, our goal is to have bike share within a 3 minute walk
- Areas in light red are 3-5 minutes walk from a station. Dark red is over 5 minutes walk from a station.

Analyzing the need in South Boston




The second map shows how walking distance would improve with the proposed stations. (Note, we won't install all of the proposed new stations!)

Analyzing the need



- "Lost trips" is an estimate of how many trips didn't occur because there are no bikes available at the station
- We use the amount of time each station was empty in a month combined with the number of trips that typically start at that station



Trips Starting or Ending in South Boston







We're growing in phases

We are adding new stations in phases.

- In **Phase 1**, we added 8 new stations in Mattapan and Dorchester in 2023 to support the Red Line shutdown.
- In **Phase 2**, we aim to add 42 stations (installation for downtown stations has started)
- In **Phase 3-5**, we aim to add 50 new stations (Spring Summer 2025)




Phase 2

Phase 2A: South End, Chinatown, Beacon Hill, Downtown, West End, North End

- ▶ Jul Aug 2024 | Community engagement
- Sep Oct 2024 | Installation
 - South End: 5-7 new stations
 - Downtown: 17-22 new stations

Phase 2B: East Boston, Charlestown, South Boston, Waterfront

- Oct Nov 2024 | Community engagement
- Dec 2024 | Installation begins
 - Charlestown: 6-8 new stations
 - East Boston: 2-5 new stations
 - South Boston & Waterfront: 7-14 new stations



Community engagement for this phase

- 4 Open Houses
 - October 17, East Boston
 - October 22, Charlestown
 - November 7, South Boston (today!)
 - November 14, virtual (bit.ly/expansion-november)
- Online Surveys(boston.gov/bike-share-survey)
 - We've posted signs and flyers at sites directing people to the surveys.



What's next for us?

- Consider all comments from Open Houses, surveys, and email
- Narrow down our list of sites
- Finalize locations and get permits

What we've heard so far

- Hundreds of responses on the survey nearly all respondents live in 02127
- Existing stations are often empty or full
 - "Great spot! Nice to have it be off the street, and the stations in either direction down Broadway are always full/empty"
- Some parts of South Boston do not have access to Bluebikes
 - "This area of Boston is a Bluebikes desert"
- Opposition from some to removing vehicle parking spaces
 - "By placing Bluebikes at this location you are taking away much needed parking."










Off-Street: Sidewalks, Plazas






Other Agencies and Departments
