Bike share today

- ► 530+ stations (290 in Boston)
- 4700 bikes (3000 in Boston), including ~750 ebikes
- Publicly owned, operating in 13 municipalities
 - Lyft = operator
 - BCBS of MA = title sponsor
 - Municipalities = owners



Boston residents ride for less with the Boston Bikes Pass






- Long-time income-eligible pass options:
 - \$50/year or \$5/month
- New discounts for Boston residents launched in October 2023
 - \$5/year for income-eligible residents
 - \$60/year for new members
 (have not had an annual membership in the last three years)

Millions of trips taken


- Over 2.6 million trips were taken on Bluebikes just in Boston in 2024 (and over 4.7 million systemwide). This number increases each year as we expand our system.
- Over a quarter (27.4%) of those trips started in Allston, Brighton, Fenway/Kenmore, or Mission Hill.


BOSTON BLUEBIKES STATIONS IN 2017










Analyzing the need in Allston-Brighton



- In areas with the most jobs and population density, our goal is to have bike share within a 3 minute walk
- Areas in light red are 3-5 minutes walk from a station. Dark red is over 5 minutes walk from a station.

Analyzing the need in Allston-Brighton




The second map shows how walking distance would improve with the proposed stations. (Note, we won't install all of the proposed new stations!)


Analyzing the need



- "Lost trips" is an estimate of how many trips didn't occur because there are no bikes available at the station
- We use the amount of time each station was empty in a month combined with the number of trips that typically start at that station







We're growing in phases

We are adding new stations in phases.

- In **Phase 1**, we added 8 new stations in Mattapan and Dorchester in 2023 to support the Red Line shutdown.
- ► In **Phase 2**, we added 18 new stations, with 25 more in progress.
- In **Phase 3-5**, we aim to add 50 new stations (Apr Dec 2025)



Phase 3

Phase 3: Allston, Brighton, Fenway/Kenmore, Mission Hill

- Feb Mar 2025 | Community engagement
- April 2025 | Installation begins
 - Allston: 6-9 new stations
 - Brighton: 6-12 new stations
 - Fenway/Kenmore: 6-12 new stations
 - Mission Hill: up to 4 new stations



Community engagement for this phase

 - We've posted flyers in the neighborhood and signs at each site directing people to the surveys.



What's next for us?

- Consider all comments from Open Houses, surveys, and email
- Narrow down our list of sites
- Finalize locations and get permits

What we've heard so far

- Over 100 responses on the Allston/Brighton surveys in 12 days since published - nearly all respondents live in 02134 or 02135
- Existing stations are often empty or full
 - "Yes!! the station around the corner is always full. having more capacity to return bikes at empty docs near the b line would be so helpful"
- Some parts of the neighborhood do not have access to Bluebikes
 - "Either this or option 11 really should get built. There are not enough options to bike to and from this part of Allston Village"
- Opposition from some to removing vehicle parking spaces
 - "Parking in the neighborhood is bad enough, more construction going on and now you want to take spaces for bikes."










Off-Street: Sidewalks, Plazas






Other Agencies and Departments
