Thank you for forwarding the Civilian Review Board's findings in connection with CRB Complaint #262 concerning Officer Mark Marron. The Department acknowledges receipt of the report and the CRB's recommendations.

The CRB reached the following findings:

Rule 102 § 9 (Respectful Treatment): *Sustained*

Rule 102 § 4 (Neglect of Duty): *Not Sustained*

Rule 304 § 2 (Use of Non-Lethal Force): *Unable to Reach a Finding*

The CRB recommended that Officer Marron receive an Oral Reprimand for the sustained violation of Rule 102§9 (Respectful Treatment).

This matter will be referred to the Internal Affairs Division (IAD) for further review. IAD will examine the CRB's findings, specifically the sustained allegation related to Rule 102 § 09 (Respectful Treatment) to determine whether the Department concurs with the finding and recommended discipline and whether any additional investigation or internal action is warranted.

To assist in expediting this review, we respectfully request that OPAT forward any relevant evidence relied upon in making its findings, including but not limited to witness statements, body-worn camera footage, interview summaries, and documentary exhibits to the attention of Superintendent Richard Dahill.

We appreciate the continued collaboration between our offices in advancing transparency and accountability in law enforcement. Please do not hesitate to contact us should additional coordination be needed during this review.
