**AMENDING CITY OF BOSTON CODE, ORDINANCES, CHAPTER VI, SECTION 6-6.3,
SCHEDULE OF PARKING FINES.**

Be it ordained by the City Council of Boston as follows:

Section 1.

City of Boston Code, Ordinances, Chapter VI, Section 6-6.3 (a), is hereby amended by striking out the words "seventy-five (\$75.00) dollars" and inserting in place thereof the following words:- ninety (\$90.00) dollars.

Section 2.

City of Boston Code, Ordinances, Chapter VI, Section 6-6.3 (b), is hereby amended by striking out the words "forty-five (\$45.00) dollars" and inserting in place thereof the following words:- seventy-five (\$75.00) dollars.

Section 3.

City of Boston Code, Ordinances, Chapter VI, Section 6-6.3 (c), is hereby amended by striking out the words "thirty (\$30.00) dollars" and inserting in place thereof the following words:- fifty-five (\$55.00) dollars.

Section 4.

City of Boston Code, Ordinances, Chapter VI, Section 6-6.3 (f), is hereby amended by striking out the words "forty dollars and no cents (\$40.00)" and inserting in place thereof the following words:- sixty (\$60.00) dollars.

City of Boston Code, Ordinances, Chapter VI, Section 6-6.3 (m), is hereby amended by striking out the words "fifty-five (\$55.00) dollars" and inserting in place thereof the following words:- ninety (\$90.00) dollars.

City of Boston Code, Ordinances, Chapter VI, Section 6-6.3 (x), is hereby amended by striking out the words "twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars" and inserting in place thereof the following words:- forty (\$40.00) dollars.

Section 9.

City of Boston Code, Ordinances, Chapter VI, Section 6-6.3 (z), is hereby amended by striking out the words "twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars" and inserting in place thereof the following words:- forty (\$40.00) dollars.

Section 10.

City of Boston Code, Ordinances, Chapter VI, Section 6-6.3 (hh), is hereby amended by striking out the words "twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars" and inserting in place thereof the following words:- fifty-five (\$55.00) dollars.

Section 11.

City of Boston Code, Ordinances, Chapter VI, Section 6-6.3 (ii), is hereby amended by striking out the words "twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars" and inserting in place thereof the following words:- forty (\$40.00) dollars.

Section 12.

City of Boston Code, Ordinances, Chapter VI, Section 6-6.3, is hereby further amended by adding the following subsection after subsection mm:-

nn. The fine for parking a vehicle in violation of any posted prohibition against parking of motor vehicles during hours designated for street cleaning that are between the hours of 12:01 AM and 7:00 AM shall be ninety (\$90.00) dollars.

Section 13.

This ordinance shall take effect upon passage.
