OF THEM AND SEVEN GRANDDAUGHTERS
WERE ALL PATIENTS OF CHILDREN'S
HOSPITAL.
AND SO ON BEHALF OF THE COUNCIL
PRESIDENT, AND MAYOR CAMPBELL,
VICE PRESIDENT, ALL THE
COUNCILLORS, WE'RE GOING TO READ
THIS PROCLAMATION.
WHEREAS BOSTON CHILDREN'S
HOSPITAL HAS FOR THE FIFTH YEAR
IN A ROW BEEN NAMED THE NUMBER 1
PEDIATRIC HOSPITAL IN THE

COUNTRY BY U.S. NEWS AND WORLD REPORT FOR THE QUALITY OF ITS CLINICAL CARE AND WE'RE ASKED, THIS DISTINCTION IS BASED ON A RIGOROUS ANALYSIS OF KEY CLINICAL DATA FROM NEARLY 200 MEDICAL CENTERS AND ASKED. THE HONOR IS ALSO BASED ON SURVEYS OF OVER 11,000 PEDIATRIC SPECIALISTS WHO ARE ASKED WHERE THEY WOULD SEND THE SICKEST CHILDREN IN THEIR SPECIALTY. AND WHEREAS BOSTON CHILDREN HAS RANKED IN THE TOP FOUR HOSPITALS IN ALL SPECIALTIES AND BEST OVERALL AND WHEREAS, IN ADDITION TO BREAKING BOUNDARIES, NEARING SOLUTIONS AND MAKING THE IMPOSSIBLE POSSIBLE FOR CHILDREN FROM ALL OVER THE WORLD. BOSTON CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL HAS FOR THE PAST 150 YEARS ALSO SERVED AS A COMMUNITY HOSPITAL FOR THE CHILDREN OF BOSTON. AND WHEREAS, IN ITS ROLE AS A COMMUNITY HOSPITAL FOR THE CHILDREN OF BOSTON, BOSTON CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL HAS BEEN A VALUED PARTNER WHERE THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS, BOSTON PUBLIC HEALTH COMMISSION, BOSTON CENTERS FOR YOUTH AND FAMILIES AND BOSTON'S NETWORK OF COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTERS. NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THE BOSTON CITY COUNCIL AND MEETING ASSEMBLED HEREBY PROCLAIM WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 22, 2018 TO BE BOSTON CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL DAY IN THE CITY OF BOSTON.
