




Purpose/Opportunities

- Opportunity for public art





- The Paul Revere House has over 250,000 visitors a year.










<u>Legend</u> Pedestrian Volumes - Saturday (10:00 AM to 6:00 PM)








Areaways











Livable

- Respect the cultural and historic context

- New ornamental lighting
- Add benches and tables to improve livability
- Parking is unchanged











Walkable

- Improve accessibility
- Widen sidewalk along Paul Revere House
- Square and North Square-East flush
- Traffic allowed but not promoted on North Square-East
- ADA compliance













Multimodal
