I ANTICIPATE THIS HEARING MAY GET A LITTLE LONG, SO I WILL BE CALLING A COUPLE PEOPLE BETWEEN PANELS TO GIVE TESTIMONY. I'D LIKE TO THANK YOU-ALL FOR BEING HERE TODAY AND WANT TO THANK ALL MY PANELISTS FOR THEIR PARTICIPATION. I KNOW THIS CAN BE A CONTENTIOUS TOPIC, BUT MOST CONVERSATIONS THAT ARE IMPORTANT ARE. THE FOCUS OF THIS HEARING IS EXPLORE ALL POSSIBLE GOVERNANCE STRUCTURES AND TO HIGHLIGHT HOW FAMILIES CAN BEST ENGAGE AND WORK TOGETHER WITH THOSE WHO MAKE EDUCATION POLICY DECISIONS FOR THEIR CHILDREN. THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE PLAYS A BIG ROLE IN OUR STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT AND THE SUCCESS OF OUR SCHOOLS. THE RESPONSIBILITIES RANGE FROM MONITORING THE ANNUAL OPERATING BUDGET TO MANAGING THE SUPERINTENDENT AND REVIEWING DISTRICT POLICIES. IT IS CRUCIAL THAT WE ARE ABLE TO HAVE PUBLIC CONVERSATIONS ABOUT THIS BODY. THIS IS AN OPPORTUNITY TO HAVE A PRODUCTIVE CONVERSATION ON WHAT IS BEST FOR OUR CHILDREN. NUMBER OF THINGS WE CAN DO TO MAKE SURE PARENTS FEEL AS THOUGH THEIR SCHOOL COMMITTEE IS TRULY LISTENING TO THEM AND REFLECTING A LOT OF THE CONCERNS WE HAVE HEARD. OBVIOUSLY, WE PLAY AN IMPORTANT ROLE AS THE DIRECTLY ELECTED REPRESENTATIVES BE IT THE DISTRICT AND THEN LARGE MEMBER OF THIS BODY, AND OUR OVERSIGHT ON THESE EDUCATION MATTERS THAT YOU, MADAME CHAIR, HAVE TAKEN A LEADERSHIP ROLE ON. APPROVAL.

THROUGH.

I HAVE OVER HERE OUR HEAD START POLICY COUNCIL CHAIR, A GRANDMOTHER. EVERYTHING WE DO REQUIRES PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT BECAUSE THAT IS A MODEL THAT REALLY DOES

WORK.
I BELIEVE COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT
ALSO WORKS TREMENDOUSLY AND HAS
FOR DECADES AS WE BROUGHT PEOPLE

WE'VE CREATED INSTITUTIONS THAT WEREN'T THERE BEFORE.

WE HAD THE FIRST PLANNING GRANT. CAME FROM ABCD TO THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS IN THE 60s, SO WE HAVE A GREAT, GREAT INVESTMENT IN SCHOOLS OF BOSTON.

I'M ONLY HERE TO SAY A FEW WORDS ABOUT THE FACT THAT MAYBE, HAVING LIVED THROUGH ALL THIS

MYSELF, IT WAS MESSY AT TIMES.

MAYBE IT WASN'T MESSY AT TIMES. BY THE WAY, THE CITY COUNCIL WAS MESSY AT TIMES TOO.

WE DIDN'T THROW YOU OUT.

I WORKED FOR A MAYOR WHO WAS IN JAIL, GREAT GUY, IN THE 50s.

DIDN'T THROW THE MAYOR OUT, SO WE'VE HAD SOME MESSY TIMES.

WE'VE HAD OTHER TIMES, BUT THE SOLUTION IN 1992 TO THROW OUT THE ELECTED SCHOOL BOARD I BELIEVE WAS TOTALLY WRONG. I BELIEVE THE REMEDY IS TO GO BACK AND REALLY LOOK AT IT SERIOUSLY.

THE YOUNGSTERS THAT THEY WILL HAVE SO WE CAN HAVE THE COUNCIL AND A SCHOOL DEPARTMENT THAT REPRESENTS THE COMMUNITY, THE ADMINISTRATION, THE

I GUESS BEING A BPS AMBASSADOR, WHICH I WAS ANOINTED I '09, AND AS A PARENT WHO SITS AND GOES TO THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE BUT DOESN'T FEEL THEY GET CHANGE WHEN THERE ARE VERY FEW OTHER PARENTS ON THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE, MY SUGGESTION WOULD BE THAT IT IS

DONE BY NEIGHBORHOOD, AN APPOINTMENT EACH. IF YOU DON'T LIKE THAT, THEN CERTAINLY WHY CAN'T WE FOLLOW THE CITY COUNCIL MODEL? WHY CAN'T WE HAVE, FOR EXAMPLE, A NUMBER ONE FOR BOSTON'S NEIGHBORHOODS OF CHARLESTOWN. NORTH END, AND EAST BOSTON. WE HAVE NOBODY TO BLAME BUT OURSELVES, BUT AT LEAST GIVE US THE OPPORTUNITY. THE IDEA OF A HYBRID. COME ON NOW.

THAT'S NOT EVEN FAIR.

THANK YOU FOR LETTING ME HAVE MY TESTIMONY.

COUNCILWOMAN, YOU AT LAST WEEK'S SCHOOL COMMITTEE MEETING, THE ONLY REASON WHY I'M HERE TONIGHT IS YOU INVITED ME. I DIDN'T KNOW THIS WAS GOING TO

HAPPEN.

THANK YOU GUYS FOR AT LEAST **PUTTING THIS ON SOMEONE'S** AGENDA. THANK YOU.

>> THANK YOU, MR. KINCAID. LAST FOR THIS EARLY TESTIMONY WILL BE BRANDY. COME ON DOWN.

>> GOOD EVENING, PRESIDENT CAMPBELL AND MADAME CHAIR ESSAIBI-GEORGE. PLEASE FORGIVE MY ILLNESS. I USE HAND SANITIZER, SO HOPEFULLY YOU DON'T CATCH MY COLD.

AS YOU KNOW, MY NAME IS BRANDY. I HAVE TESTIFIED BEFORE YOU TWICE IN AN EIGHT-DAY PERIOD. I'M THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF EDUCATORS FOR EXCELLENCE, A TEACHER NONPROFIT THAT WORKS TO ELEVATE TEACHER VOICE IN THE POLICY MAKING PROCESS. THANK YOU FOR ALLOWING ME TO SPEAK ON THIS IMPORTANT ISSUE THIS EVENING. AFTER HEARING FROM OUR MEMBERS

THIS FALL, IT IS CLEAR THAT THIS ISSUE IS NOT ABOUT HOW THE COMMITTEE IS STRUCTURED BUT MORE ABOUT ACCOUNTABILITY AND COMMUNITY INPUT INTO THE PROCESS.

BEFORE SHARING THEIR VIEWPOINTS, I WOULD LIKE TO REMIND US ALL THE REASON WE MOVED FROM ELECTED

TO APPOINTED IS POST

DESEGREGATION AND BUSING.

AS A GRADUATE OF BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS, I AM ACUTELY AWARE AND

HAVE HEARD THE STORIES OF WHAT

THOSE TIMES WERE LIKE.

AT THAT TIME, BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS WAS LARGELY BLACK AND WHITE.

DRAMATIC MEASURES WERE TAKEN. THE ERADICATION OF AN ELECTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE.

HOWEVER, OUR CITY DEMOGRAPHICS HAVE CHANGED AND WE'RE FINALLY SEEING BOSTON STARTING TO GRAPPLE IN EARNEST.

WE MUST ASK OURSELVES IS THE STATUS QUO DECISION POST BUSING

IS STILL NECESSARY TODAY.

SINCE AUGUST, WE HAVE SURVEYED MORE THAN 500 EDUCATORS ON THE

TOPICS OF CURRENT POLICY IN BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

IN THE PAST TWO MONTHS ALONE,

200 EDUCATORS WEIGHED IN ON THE

ISSUE OF SCHOOL GOVERNANCE.

WHAT WE'RE HEARING FROM OUR

MEMBERS IS THAT THE REAL

GOVERNANCE PROBLEMS IS NOT HOW

THE MEMBERS ARE SELECTED.

THE REAL ISSUE IS WHETHER OR NOT

THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE IS TRULY

ACCOUNTABLE TO THE NEEDS OF

BOSTON FAMILIES, STUDENTS, AND EDUCATORS.

DARE I EVEN SAY A METHOD FOR AUTHENTIC COMMUNITY INPUT AND ENGAGEMENT TO CREATE AND IDEATE ON POLICIES.

THE REAL QUESTION IS ALL ABOUT ACCOUNTABILITY.

ONLY 3% OF OUR MEMBERS

IDENTIFIED A PLACEMENT AS THEIR

PREFERRED METHOD OF SELECTING MEMBERS FOR THE BOSTON SCHOOL

COMMITTEE.

THE REMAINING 97% SURVEYED SAID THEY WERE DISSATISFIED WITH THE STATUS QUO AND EXPECTED EITHER AN ELECTED OR HYBRID METHOD. 42% CHOOSING A HYBRID. SPECIFICALLY, MICHELLE, A TEACHER AT THE HOME INNOVATION SCHOOL SHARED, THE BOSTON SCHOOL COMMITTEE SHOULD HAVE ELECTED POSITIONS AS OPPOSED TO APPOINTMENTS BY THE MAYOR TO OFFER COMMUNITY INPUT IN THE DECISION-MAKING PROSPER TAKEN

-- SCHOOL COMMITTEE ELECTIONS CAN FOSTER COMMUNITY INVESTMENT IN THE DISTRICT BY ALLOWING FOR INCREASED COMMUNITY VOICE. WHILE TEACHERS ARE SPLIT ON WHAT THE STRUCTURE SHOULD BE, THERE IS AGREEMENT THAT CHANGE IS NECESSARY AND THAT STEMS FROM A NEED FOR ACCOUNTABILITY. THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE IS TASKED WITH HOLDING BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS ACCOUNTABLE, BUT WHO HOLDS THEM ACCOUNTABLE? SOME WOULD SAY THE MAYOR. HOWEVER, WE RECOGNIZE THAT BOSTON IS A CITY HERALDED FOR A DE FACTO TRADITION OF ELECTS GENERATIONAL MAYORS THAT REMAIN IN OFFICE FOR YEARS, DECADES EVEN.

IF THE ONLY OPTION IS VOTING IN
A NEW MAYOR, THE COMMUNITY WOULD
HAVE NO MEASURE AT ALL IN
ENSURING ACCOUNTABILITY.
EVERY VOICE HAS TO MATTER, AND
THERE MUST BE MULTIPLE AVENUES
FOR ENGAGEMENT.
WHAT IS CLEAR IS THIS.
EVEN IF THE STRUCTURE STAYED THE

WHAT IS CLEAR IS THIS.
EVEN IF THE STRUCTURE STAYED THE
SAME, THE DISTRICT NEEDS TO
CONTINUE TO FIND BETTER WAYS TO
THOUGHT PARTNER AND COLLABORATE
WITH TEACHERS, FAMILY MEMBERS,
BUSINESSES, CLERGY, BPS ALUMNI,
AND OTHER CITIZENS AND
STAKEHOLDERS THROUGHOUT ALL OF
BOSTON TO ENSURE STUDENTS GET
THE BEST EDUCATION POSSIBLE.
WHAT CANNOT CONTINUE ARE CLOSED

DOOR PROCESSES AND BACK DOOR DEALS.
OUR MEMBERS WANT LEADERS WHETHER ELECTED OR APPOINTED WHO GET AT ROOT CAUSES AND HELP GROW SOLUTIONS.
THANK YOU FOR THIS OPPORTUNITY TO SPEAK AND SHARE INSIGHTS WITH OUR CONVERSATIONS WITH EDUCATORS.

>> THANK YOU, BRANDY.
BRANDY, WOULD YOU SHARE THE
RESULTS OF THAT SURVEY?

>> YES.

>> THANK YOU VERY MUCH, BRANDY. THANK YOU FOR YOUR REGULAR TESTIMONY, BOTH YOURS AND THE TEACHERS THAT YOU WORK WITH. THANK YOU. WE'RE GOING TO SHIFT GEARS TO OUR FIRST PANEL. I DO HAVE A FEW SLIDES. WE MIGHT REFERENCE SOME THINGS THAT THE SLIDE WILL PERTAIN TO. SAM AND COUNCILOR DECAR. THANK YOU FOLKS FOR BEING HERE. I'LL LET YOU INTRODUCE YOURSELF. I'LL LET THE FORMER COUNCILOR GO FIRST. WE'LL GET TO IT. THANK YOU.

>> FOR THE RECORD, LAWRENCE TECARA, WARD 9, PRECINCT 3, AS COUNCILOR O'MALLEY KNOWS. AS ONE WHO SERVED ON THE CITY COUNCIL FOR TEN YEARS WHEN THIS CHAMBER WAS IN ITS FIRST ITERATION, I'M HONORED TO SPEAK BEFORE YOU THIS EVENING. I'VE SUBMITTED EXCERPTS TO COUNCILOR ESSAIBI-GEORGE OF SOME ACADEMIC RESEARCH I DID ALMOST 50 YEARS CONCERNING THE HISTORY OF THE BOSTON SCHOOL COMMITTEE. AND IT SHOWS MANY THINGS. INCLUDING THAT THE TOPIC OF THE COMMITTEE HAS BEEN ONE OF INTENSE PUBLIC DISCUSSION OFF AND ON FOR APPROXIMATELY 150 YEARS.

THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE HAS HAD MANY DIFFERENT STRUCTURES OVER A PERIOD OF TIME. WHAT I WILL FOCUS ON IN MY TESTIMONY IS WHAT HAPPENS IN THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE AFTER I DID THAT RESEARCH IN 1970 AND '71. I ALSO DO SO AS A GRADUATE OF THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS, K-12. MAYBE JUST AS IMPORTANTLY, MY MOTHER WAS A BOSTON SCHOOLTEACHER FOR 34 YEARS, SO I LEARNED PLENTY AROUND THE KITCHEN TABLE. THE 70s WERE NOT A GOOD DECADE FOR THE BOSTON SCHOOL COMMITTEE. I SERVED ON THE COUNCIL FOR MOST OF THAT DECADE. TWO MEMBERS OF THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE WENT TO JAIL. OTHERS WERE INDICTED BUT NOT CONVICTED. THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE POSITIONED THEMSELVES SO AS TO BRING ABOUT A COURT ORDER, WHICH BROUGHT ABOUT THE DESEGREGATION OF OUR SCHOOLS. THEY VIOLATED THE LAW, PLAIN AND SIMPLE. DIDN'T HAVE TO BE A CONSTITUTIONAL SCHOLAR. JUST HAD TO BE ABLE TO READ. THE ENACTMENT OF THE DESEGREGATION PLAN, WHICH ARGUABLY HAS LEFT THE FOREST OF OUR CHILDREN NOT MUCH BETTER OFF THAN THEY WERE 50 YEARS AGO. THAT'S A DEBATE FOR ANOTHER DAY. I SPENT MUCH OF MY TIME SITTING OVER ON THAT SIDE BECAUSE WE DO IT ALPHABETICALLY, SO THE Bs AND THE Cs AND THE Ds ALWAYS SIT OVER THERE, ARGUING THAT THE COUNCIL AND THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE, AS THEY THEN EXISTED, ALL ELECTED AT LARGE WERE NOT REPRESENTATIVE BODIES EITHER WITH RESPECT TO RACE OR GENDER OR GEOGRAPHY.

THAT REASON I CHAMPIONED THE MIXED AT-LARGE DISTRICT SYSTEM, WHICH I WOULD ARGUE, EVEN IF I WEREN'T HERE, HAS DONE QUITE WELL HERE AT THE CITY COUNCIL BUT WHICH WAS AN ABYSMAL DISASTER WHEN APPLIED TO THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE.
AND I ADMIT I WAS ONE OF THE LEADERS OF THE REFERENDUM, WHICH PASSED IN '81, WHICH BROUGHT ABOUT THAT SYSTEM TO SWITCH FROM THE FIVE AT-LARGE TO NINE AND FOUR.

DEEP IN MY HEART, I BELIEVED, AS DID MANY OTHERS, INCLUDING SOME OF OUR BUSINESS LEADERS, THAT A SCHOOL COMMITTEE SYSTEM WHERE THE MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS WERE ELECTED BY DISTRICTS WOULD ENCOURAGE PARENTS AND OTHERS WHO WERE LEGITIMATELY CONCERNED ABOUT EDUCATION RATHER THAN OBSESSED ABOUT POLITICS TO RUN FOR THOSE SEATS.

THERE WERE SOME DECENT PEOPLE WHO SERVED ON THOSE COMMITTEES. MANY OF WHOM ARE FRIENDS TO THIS DAY, BUT THERE WERE MANY WHO RAN ONLY BECAUSE THERE WAS AN AVAILABLE OFFICE.

IT WAS INTERESTING EDUCATION DI MINUTE MUS.

MOST IMPORTANTLY, THE
INTERFERENCE OF THE SCHOOL
COMMITTEE IN THE DAY-TO-DAY
BUSINESS OF GOVERNING A VERY
COMPLEX URBAN SCHOOL SYSTEM IS A
PRIMARY VARIABLE WHICH BROUGHT
ABOUT THE TURNOVER IN SCHOOL
SUPERINTENDENTS IN THE DECADES

OF THE 80s AND EARLY 90s.
I HAD THE HONOR OF REPRESENTING
A SUPERINTENDENT WHEN HE BOUGHT

HIS HOUSE NOT TOO FAR FROM WHERE

WE GREW UP.

THEN THE HONOR OF REPRESENTING HIM WHEN HE SOLD IT ABOUT THREE YEARS LATER.

THERE'S NO DOUBT IN MY MIND THAT HE WOULD HAVE BEEN A LONG-TERM SUPERINTENDENT AS WAS THE SUPERINTENDENT IN THE 90s BUT FOR THE PESTERING BY THE MEMBERS OF THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE BY PATRONAGE AND OTHER MATTERS. HE WENT ON TO RUN ONE OF THE LARGEST SCHOOL SYSTEMS IN THE COUNTRY IN FAIRFAX, VIRGINIA.

WHOSE JOB IT WAS TO TASTE HER FOOD.
THEREFORE, I WAS ONE OF MANY
PEOPLE WHO CARE ABOUT THE CITY
AND WORKED VERY HARD TO BRING
ABOUT THE APPOINTED COMMITTEE IN
THE EARLY 90s AND THEN WORKED
HARD TO BE SURE IT WAS SPOTHSUPPORTED
BY THE VOTERS ON TWO OCCASIONS.
I THINK IT WAS ABOUT 70-30.
I THINK IT PREVAILED IN 16, 17,
OR 18 OF THE 22 WARDS.

ONE MEMBER EVEN SUGGESTED TO ME SHE HAD A GENTLEMAN ON HER STAFF

>> 20.

>> OH, IT'S 20 OF THE 22? OKAY, YOU GOT ME ON A POLITICAL FACT. I HOPE THAT'S STRICKEN FROM THE RECORD, OKAY?

>> I'LL TALK TO YOU LATER.

IT WAS A VERY EXPENIVE

PROPOSITION.

>> THE WONDERFUL THING ABOUT THE APPOINTED COMMITTEE IS THAT THEY DO NOT INTERFERE IN THE DAY-TO-DAY OPERATION OF THE SCHOOL SYSTEM. THEY DO NOT VIEW THEIR JOB AS BEING ONE OF PROVIDING EMPLOYMENT OF WHICH WE CURRENTLY HAVE 9500 EMPLOYEES MORE OR LESS FOR A SCHOOL SYSTEM OF APPROXIMATELY 57,000 STUDENTS. I BELIEVE, AS DO MANY OTHERS, FOR US TO RETURN TO PLACING NAMES ON THE BALLOT FOR ELECTION TO THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE WOULD RESULT IN EXTRAORDINARY DIVISIVENESS AND WOULD MAKE IT LESS LIKELY THAT SUPERINTENDENTS WOULD STAY IN BOSTON. THANK YOU. HAPPY TO RESPOND.

>> THANK YOU VERY MUCH.
I THINK WE'LL TAKE TESTIMONY
FROM SAM AND THEN WE'LL OPEN IT
UP.

>> SAM HAS ABOUT AS MUCH MILEAGE ON HIS TIRES AS I DO EXCEPT HE GOES TO MORE SCHOOL COMMITTEE MEETINGS. HE SPEAKS FROM EXPERTISE.

>> YOU CAN NOW WATCH THEM ONLINE AND STREAM THEM LIVE.

>> I GOT SPOILED IN TERMS OF OUR OFFICE BEING A BLOCK AWAY FROM 26 COURT STREET.
IT'S A WHOLE OTHER MATTER NOW. MADAME CHAIR AND MEMBERS, FOR THE RECORD, MY NAME IS SAM TYLER.
I'M THE PRESIDENT OF THE BOSTON RESEARCH BUREAU.
I GUESS INFLUENCED BY JOHN DREW, I'M GOING TO TELL YOU THAT I

HAVE BEEN OBSERVING AND WRITING ABOUT THE BOSTON SCHOOL COMMITTEE SINCE 1972, SO I'VE SEEN FIRSTHAND THE BOSTON PUBLIC

SCHOOLS WHO WERE THE WORST AND SOME BETTERED BY THE SCHOOL COMMITTEES.

THE DYSFUNCTION OF THE 13 ELECTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE. SINCE 1992, THE SEVEN-MEMBER APPOINTED COMMITTEE.

FROM THESE YEARS OF EXPERIENCE, I CAN UNEQUIVOCALLY STATE THAT THE APPOINTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE STRUCTURE AFFORDS BOSTON THE BEST CHANCE TO IMPROVE SCHOOL PERFORMANCE IN ALL AREAS -- ACADEMIC, OPERATIONAL, FISCAL, AND MANAGERIAL.

NOW, I THINK WE ALL AGREE THAT NO BOARD STRUCTURE BY ITSELF IS GOING TO BE A SOLUTION TO THE CHALLENGES FACING THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

HOWEVER, GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE CAN FACILITATE THE SUPPORT FOR EFFECTIVE IMPLEMENTATION OF POLICIES TO IMPROVE TEACHING, STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT, AND OPERATIONS.

ALSO, WANT TO SAY AT THE BEGINNING THAT WHILE SCHOOL GOVERNANCE HAS BEEN AN ISSUE THAT COMES AND GOES, THERE ARE MORE IMPORTANT ISSUES THAT WE SHOULD BE DEVOTING OUR ATTENTION TO AND OUR ENERGY TO THAT WOULD HAVE FAR MORE BENEFIT TO THE PARENTS AND STUDENTS OF THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS THAN SCHOOL GOVERNANCE. TURN AROUND OF UNDERPERFORMING SCHOOLS, STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT GAP PARTICULARLY BY RACE, BILL BPS, PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT AND **EVALUATION TO IMPROVE EFFECTIVE** TEACHING. THESE ARE JUST A FEW OF THE ISSUES THAT REALLY OUGHT TO BE

ISSUES THAT REALLY OUGHT TO BE ADDRESSED.
GOING BACK TO THE APPOINTED STRUCTURE, WE HAVE SUPPORTED --

WE WERE INVOLVED WITH THE CREATION OF THE APPOINTED BOARD. THE MAIN REASON BECAUSE IT HOLDS THE MAYOR FULLY ACCOUNTABLE FOR PUBLIC EDUCATION AND ALSO THAT

THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE CAN BE MORE

DIVERSE.

WE HAVE A MIX OF EXPERIENCES AND SKILLS TO BE A COHESIVE EDUCATIONAL BODY.

FOR THE PAST 25 YEARS OR 26 YEARS, THE APPOINTED COMMITTEE

HAS PROVEN TO BE MORE

EDUCATIONALLY FOCUSED, FISCALLY

RESPONSIBLE, AND BETTER ABLE TO

TACKLE IMPORTANT BUT POLITICAL

DIFFICULT ISSUES THAN THE RECORD DEMONSTRATED BY EITHER OF THE

FIVE-MEMBER ELECTED MEMBER OR

THE 13-MEMBER ELECTED COMMITTEE.

ON THE ELECTED COMMITTEE, SCHOOL

MEMBERS WERE MORE CONCERNED WITH

DAY-TO-DAY OPERATIONS THAN THEY

WERE WITH BROAD EDUCATIONAL

POLICY.

THEIR ISSUES OF CONCERN WERE MORE FRANKLY CONSTITUENT ISSUES NOT RELATED TO EDUCATIONAL POLICY.

THE CONSTITUENTS WERE NOT THE STUDENTS BUT THE ADULTS.
BOSTON'S MOVED TO THE APPOINTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE STRUCTURE.
IT EVOLVED OVER A DECADE OF ATTEMPTS TO MAKE THE ELECTED

PROCESS WORK.

IT CAME ABOUT ONLY A SERIES OF

EFFORTS TO IMPROVE GOVERNANCE OF

SCHOOLS WITHIN THE EXISTING

ELECTED STRUCTURE ON FOUR

SEPARATE OCCASIONS.

LEGISLATION WAS ENACTED WHICH

FOCUSED ON STRENGTHENING THE

ROLE OF THE SUPERINTENDENT AND

LIMITING THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE'S

ROLE TO MORE OF A POLICY BODY,

WHICH EVENTUALLY FELT THAT

WASN'T ENOUGH.

THE PRIMARY BENEFIT OF THE

APPOINTED COMMITTEE IS THAT IT

HOLDS ONE PERSON ACCOUNTABLE FOR

BOSTON SCHOOL PERFORMANCE, THE

MAYOR.

THE FUNDAMENTAL FLAW OF THE

ELECTED COMMITTEE WAS THAT IT

DID NOT ENSURE DIRECT

ACCOUNTABILITY IN ANY ONE PERSON

OR BOARD.

THE MAYOR WAS REQUIRED TO RAISE

THE FUNDS TO SUPPORT THE SYSTEM,

BUT THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE DECIDED

HOW THE MONEY WOULD BE SPENT.

THE DIVISION OF DUTIES

CONTRIBUTED TO A CULTURE OF

MISTRUST AND FINGER POINTING

RATHER THAN IMPROVED

COLLABORATION THAT EXISTS TODAY.

THIS DIRECT ACCOUNTABILITY MUST

BE MAINTAINED.

IT WOULD BE WEAKENED, I BELIEVE,

THROUGH AN ELECTED OR HYBRID

STRUCTURE.

THE APPOINTED COMMITTEE HAS BEEN

FAR MORE SUCCESSFUL IN CREATING

THAT STABILITY DURING TOM'S TIME

MADE A BIG DIFFERENCE WHICH

ACADEMIC STUDIES HAVE SHOWN IN

TERMS OF STUDENT PERFORMANCE.

THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE HAS THE DUTY TO EXERCISE ITS IDUCIARY

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RESPONSIBILITIES. THE ELECTED STRUCTURE INCLUDED NO INCENTIVE FOR THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE TO CONTROL SPENDING OR ANY PENALTY IF IT DID NOT. EVERY YEAR SINCE 1992 UNDER THE APPOINTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE THE SCHOOL DEPARTMENT HAS ENDED WITH A SURPLUS. THERE'S ALSO FINANCIAL BENEFITS FOR HAVING THE MAYOR'S DIRECT ACCOUNTABILITY FOR THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS. THE FACT THAT OVER THE LAST TEN YEARS DURING DIFFICULT FISCAL TIMES AND ESCALATING STATE ASSESSMENTS, HEALTH INSURANCE COSTS, PENSION COSTS, THE SCHOOL DEPARTMENT'S SHARE OF THE TOTAL DEPARTMENTAL BUDGET IN THE CITY REMAINED STEADY AT 35%. ALL OTHER DEPARTMENTS OTHER THAN POLICE AND FIRE IN AGGREGATE REPRESENTED A SMALLER SHARE OF THE TOTAL DEPARTMENTAL BUDGET OVER THE TEN YEARS. DURING THIS TIME, STATE CHARTERED SCHOOL ASSESSMENT INCREASED BY \$118 OR 21%. THE BPS WAS HELD HARMLESS AS THE CITY OF BOSTON ABSORBED THOSE EXPENSES. NOT THE SCHOOL DEPARTMENT.

THAT'S NOT THE CASE IN OTHER
SCHOOL DISTRICTS IN THIS STATE
THAT HAVE CHARTER SCHOOLS.
AS YOU KNOW, THE CHARTER SCHOOL
TUITION REPRESENTS THE CHAPTER
70 EDUCATION AID THAT FOLLOWS
THE STUDENT THAT LIVE IN BOSTON
BUT GO TO CHARTER SCHOOLS.
ALSO, IN THE CURRENT FISCAL
FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL BOND PLAN,
TOTAL BOND FUNDING FOR SCHOOLS
REPRESENTS 28% OF THE TOTAL.
22nd IS PUBLIC WORKS, WHICH
REPRESENT 18%.
NOT ONLY IN THE OPERATING BUDGET

NOT ONLY IN THE OPERATING BUDGET OR THE CAPITAL BUDGET. THE FACT THAT THE MAYOR HAS DIRECT RESPONSIBILITY FOR SCHOOL PERFORMANCE DOES MAKE A DIFFERENCE IN THE FINANCIAL BENEFIT OF THE SCHOOL DEPARTMENT.

ALSO, BY MAKING THE MAYOR FULLY

ACCOUNTABLE FOR EDUCATION

PERFORMANCE, A LARGER NUMBER OF

VOTERS ARE ABLE TO INFLUENCE

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT THAN A

SMALLER NUMBER OF VOTERS WHO

WOULD DIVIDE THEIR MANDATE AMONG

ELECTED COMMITTEE MEMBERS.

MORE VOTERS IN BOSTON GOING TO

THE POLLS TO VOTE FOR MAYOR THAN

ANY OTHER ELECTED POSITION.

FAR MORE VOTERS HOLD THE BPS

ACCOUNTABLE BY VOTING FOR THE

MAYOR THAN THOSE WHO WOULD VOTE

FOR THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE RACES.

PRIOR TO 1992, SCHOOL COMMITTEE

RACES LACKED COMPETITION AS WELL AS VOTES.

IN 1989, THE LAST ELECTED

RACE -- I'M SORRY, THE LAST

ELECTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE RACE

ENCOMPASSED FOUR OUT OF NINE

DISTRICTS.

THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE RACES RAN

UNOPPOSED.

NO COMMITTEE CANDIDATE IN A

COMPETITIVE RACE RECEIVED MORE

THAN 16% OF THE VOTE.

THAT'S NOT REALLY PARENT

REPRESENTATION.

PARENTS HAVE A ROLE NOT ONLY AS

VOTERS BUT ALSO THEY CAN SERVE

ON THE SCHOOL COUNCILS AND HAVE

MORE SAY IN TERMS OF THE

OPERATION OF THEIR CHILDREN'S

SCHOOL AS WELL AS SELECTING THE

TEACHERS TO WORK IN THOSE

SCHOOLS.

THAT'S HOW REALLY PARENTS CAN BE

INVOLVED IN TERMS OF WHAT'S

IMPORTANT TO THEM.

AS YOU KNOW, THE LEGISLATION IN

CREATING THE APPOINTED BOARD

REQUIRED FIVE YEARS AFTERWARDS

IN 1996 FOR A BONDING QUESTION

TO ASK WHETHER VOTERS WANTED TO

SAY WITH THE CURRENT 13-MEMBER

STRUCTURE OR GO BACK -- I'M

SORRY.

STAY WITH THE CURRENT BOARD OR

GO BACK TO THE 13-MEMBER

STRUCTURE.

IT WAS A 70-30 MARGIN TO RETAIN

THE CURRENT SEVEN-MINUTE APPOINTED STRUCTURE RATHER THAN RETURN. IN FACT, THAT VOTE WAS A PLURALITY OF ABOUT 59,000 VOTES. THE STABILITY AND STEADY PROGRESS IN BOSTON UNDER THE APPOINTED BOARD HAS GIVEN NATIONAL AND LOCAL FOUNDATIONS AND BUSINESSES CONFIDENCE IN FINANCIALLY SUPPORTING A VARIETY OF EDUCATION INITIATIVES. IN 2006, THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS DEPARTMENT WAS AWARDED A PRIZE FOR BEING THE NATION'S MOST IMPROVED URBAN SCHOOL SYSTEM. AND THE SCHOOL DEPARTMENT WAS A FINALIST FOR THIS AWARD FOR THE THREE PREVIOUS YEARS. THE HYBRID STRUCTURE HAS BEEN INTRODUCED, AS WAS NOTED RECENTLY BY COUNCILOR BAKER.

RECOMMENDATION, I GUESS, IN 1989, WHICH WAS -- THERE WERE TWO COMMISSION STUDIES BACK THEN. ONE WAS CHAIRED BY JONES.

ONE WAS CHAIRED BY JONES.
THAT COMMISSION MADE A
RECOMMENDATION OF MOVING FROM
THE ELECTED TO APPOINTED
STRUCTURE.

IT WAS ALSO PART OF A COMMISSION

A SECOND ONE WAS SUGGESTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL, APPOINTED BY THE MAYOR, THAT THE COMMISSION CAME BACK AND SUGGESTED ALL APPOINTED OR A HYBRID SYSTEM OF PARTLY ELECTED, PARTLY APPOINTED.

IN 1989, THE HYBRID STRUCTURE
WAS QUICKLY DISMISSED AS BEING
DIVISIVE AND INCOMPATIBLE WITH
REAL ACCOUNTABILITY WITHOUT ANY
CLEAR LINE OF AUTHORITY.
THE REPORT ON THE HYBRID
STRUCTURE OPPOSED IT FEELING
THAT IT WOULD INHIBIT THE
COMMUNITY'S ABILITY TO FUNCTION
OR THE COMMITTEE'S ABILITY TO
FUNCTION AS A POLICY BODY.
NO BOARD STRUCTURE BY ITSELF IS
THE SOLUTION TO THE CHALLENGES

FACING THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS. HOWEVER, EXISTING APPOINTED BOARD STRUCTURE IS THE BEST CHANCE TO ENSURE THAT THE MAYOR REMAINS FULLY ACCOUNTABLE FOR PUBLIC EDUCATION, THAT SCHOOL MEMBERS HAVE THE MIX OF EXPERIENCES AND SKILLS TO BE COHESIVE EDUCATIONAL BODY, AND THAT THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE RESPONSIBLY EXERCISES ITS FIDUCIARY RESPONSIBILITY. I THINK BOTH LARRY AND I HAVE SEEN THE SITUATION WHERE THE MAYOR USES THE MONEY BUT DOESN'T HAVE ANY KIND OF A ROLE IN THE OPERATION, EVEN FROM A DISTANCE. I THINK THERE'S BEEN A MARKET IN TERMS OF THE COLLABORATION BETWEEN CITY HALL AND NOW 23 RUSSIAN STREET THAN THERE HAS BEEN EVER WITH THE ELECTED COMMITTEE.

I JUST WANT TO RAISE ONE LAST ISSUE, MAYBE TWO. IN TERMS OF THE NOMINATING PROCESS, THE MAYOR DOESN'T HAVE

CARTE BLANCHE.

NOMINATING PROCESS WAS CREATED WITH THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE APPOINTED BOARD AND WAS INTENDED TO CREATE A LEVEL OF INDEPENDENCE.
THERE ARE 13 MEMBERS ON THE

PANEL.

THE MAYOR ONLY APPOINTS FOUR.
THE PANEL MAKES RECOMMENDATIONS
FOR EACH OPEN POSITION OF NO
LESS THAN THREE NOMINEES, NO
MORE THAN FIVE.

AND THE MAYOR MUST APPOINT ONE OF THOSE INDIVIDUALS, SO IT IS AN INDEPENDENT PROCESS, AND IT'S A PROCESS THAT'S AN OPEN PROCESS.

THE MEETINGS OF THE PANEL ARE PUBLIC, EVEN THE INTERVIEWS ARE PUBLIC.

IT'S ONLY WHEN THERE'S DISCUSSION IN TERMS OF WHICH OF THE NOMINEES TO SELECT THAT THEY GO INTO EXECUTIVE SESSION.

FOLKS WILL NOTE THAT, YES, BOSTON IS THE ONLY CITY IN THE STATE THAT HAS AN APPOINTED BOARD BUT FOR GOOD REASON. BUT THAT STARTED A PROCESS THAT NOW THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. MAJOR CITIES -- THERE ARE OVER 20 CITIES WHERE THERE'S AN APPOINTED BOARD BY THE MAYOR. I THINK IT'S BECAUSE THE MAYORS REALIZE THAT PUBLIC EDUCATION IS CRITICAL TO THE VITALITY OF THE CITY AND THEY NEED TO PLAY A ROLE AND ENSURE THAT IT'S PROTECTED, THAT IT'S WELL SUPPORTED, AND IT SERVES THE INTEREST OF THE STUDENTS AND THE PARENTS. THAT'S THE POINT OF THE APPOINTED BOARD HERE.

>> THANK YOU, SAM.
ON THE OVERHEAD, FOR THOSE OF
YOU THAT ARE HERE IN THE
CHAMBER, I PULLED UP CURRENT
CITIZENS NOMINATING PANEL, THE
MEMBERSHIP, AND THE LIST OF
MEMBERS OF THAT BOARD.
AT THIS TIME, I WOULD LIKE TO
OPEN UP FOR QUESTIONS FROM MY
COLLEAGUES.

>> I LISTENED TO BOTH TESTIMONY, AND I CERTAINLY APPRECIATE YOUR LONG-TERM SERVICE TO THE CITY OF BOSTON, BOTH OF YOU, SO I'M MORE EAGER TO LISTEN TO TESTIMONY.

>> THANK YOU, MADAME CHAIR.
DITTO.
APPRECIATE LARRY AND SAM, BOTH
OF YOUR LONG AND LOYAL SERVICE
TO OUR GREAT CITY.
I JUST WANTED TO PUSH BACK ON
SOMETHING YOU SAID.
YOU SAID THERE ARE MORE
IMPORTANT ISSUES WE SHOULD BE
FOCUSED ON, WE BEING THE CITY
COUNCIL.

>> I ACTUALLY MEANT CITY.

>> FAIR POINT.
WHATEVER.
I THINK THAT THAT SORT OF DOES A
DISSERVICE TO WHAT WE'RE TRYING
TO DO HERE BECAUSE WE ARE, A,
CAPABLE OF FOCUSING ON MORE THAN
ONE ISSUE AT A TIME AS IT
RELATES TO BUILD BPS OR EQUITY
OR STUDENT ASSIGNMENT, BUT THESE
ARE ISSUES THAT WE'RE WORKING ON
IN TANDEM WITH THAT.

>> WHICH ALSO INCLUDES THE ACHIEVEMENT GAP.

>> WE'RE WORKING ON ALL THESE ISSUES. I THINK THE FACT THAT DESPITE THAT MANY PEOPLE IN THIS ROOM, MANY PARENTS, MANY TEACHERS, MANY ACTIVISTS ARE AT THIS MEETING TONIGHT OR AT ANOTHER MEETING TWO NIGHTS IF NOW SHOWS A REAL DESIRE FOR INVOLVEMENT IN HAVING TEACHER VOICES. HAVING PARENTS' VOICES, HAVING STUDENTS' VOICES MOST IMPORTANTLY INY ESTIMATION. I THINK THAT'S A LAZY ARGUMENT TO MAKE THAT WE SHOULDN'T DO THAT BECAUSE THERE'S OTHER THINGS WE SHOULD BE FOCUSING ON. THERE'S PLENTY OF BANDWIDTH AND BRAINPOWER IN THIS ROOM TO ECHO A WHOLE HOST OF ISSUES. SIMILARLY, LARRY, I THINK YOU MADE SOME COMPELLING POINTS. THIS IS SOMETHING THAT I'VE OFTEN SORT OF GRAPPLED WITH AS IT RELATES TO THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE. I BEGAN MY PROCESS THINKING WE SHOULD GO BACK TO THE ALL

I BEGAN MY PROCESS THINKING WE SHOULD GO BACK TO THE ALL ELECTED SCHOOL BOARD BECAUSE OF SOME OF THE HISTORICAL CONTEXT YOU PROVIDED AND IN MY OWN RESEARCH.

I THINK THE HYBRID MODEL IS SOMETHING WE OUGHT TO EMBRACE BECAUSE IT WOULD ALLOW FOR SOME FOLKS WHO WOULD BE APPOINTED AND SORT OF HAVE THAT FREEDOM OF NOT HAVING TO STAND FOR ELECTION WHILE AT THE SAME TIME ALLOWING AN INDIVIDUAL TO BE MORE ACCOUNTABLE TO THE VOTERS AND THE PARENTS AND THE STAKEHOLDERS OF BPS.

I KNOW THERE ARE PLENTY OF GOOD PEOPLE WHO CAN DISAGREE ON HOW WE GET THERE, BUT I DO THINK THAT THERE'S ENORMOUS BENEFIT TO HAVING THIS HEARING AND CONTINUING THIS CONVERSATION, EXPLORING WHAT SOME OTHER OPTIONS ARE.

I GUESS MY QUESTION IS, IF WE NOW ARE 20-PLUS YEARS -- I GUESS CLOSER TO 30 YEARS OF HAVING THIS CURRENT MODEL.

WHY HAVEN'T ANY OTHER CITIES OR TOWNS IN MASSACHUSETTS FOLLOWED SUIT?

PARTICULARLY WORCESTER, SPRINGFIELD, LARGER CITIES. WHY HAVEN'T OTHERS FOLLOWED SUIT?

>> I EXPECT BECAUSE THEIR SYSTEMS ARE NOT AS COMPLEX AS OURS.

THAT'S JUST A GUESS.
I'M BEING HONEST WITH YOU.
I RAN STATEWIDE 40 YEARS AGO.
I DON'T SPEND A LOT OF TIME

I DON'T SPEND A LOT OF TIME OUTSIDE OF BOSTON, SO I'M NOT AS ATTUNED AS I MAY HAVE BEEN BACK THEN.

THE COMMONWEALTH HAS A HISTORY GOING BACK TO THE FOUNDING OF BOSTON SCHOOLS IN 1635 OF HAVING SCHOOL COMMITTEES.

THEY HAD ALL SORTS OF SHAPES AND SIZES, AND THEY'VE HAD VARYING ATTEMPTS.

IF ONE GOES BACK FAR ENOUGH, IT BASICALLY WAS THE INTENT OF THE PROTESTANT MAJORITY TO AMERICANIZE CATHOLICS BY INSISTING UPON THE READING OF THE KING JAMES VERSION OF THE BIBLE AND THINGS LIKE THAT. THAT'S REALLY THE LEGACY OF HORACE MANN.
THE RESEARCH THAT I DID FOR

COUNCILOR ESSAIBI-GEORGE, THERE'S A VERY INTERESTING DECADE OR SO WHEN WOMEN COULD VOTE FOR SCHOOL COMMITTEE BUT COULD NOT VOTE FOR ANYTHING ELSE

ELSE. I THINK IT WAS THE 1880s. I DON'T HAVE TOTAL RECALL AND NEITHER OF US WAS THERE, ALTHOUGH IT'S CLOSE. THEN THE CATHOLIC CHURCH DECIDED THAT A WOMAN'S PLACE WAS IN THE KITCHEN AND NOT VOTING, SO A WHOLE BUNCH OF PROTESTANTS WERE ELECTED TO SCHOOL COMMITTEE. ALMOST BY DIVINE INTERVENTION, SOMEBODY DECIDED THAT MAYBE WOMEN COULD VOTE AND THERE WAS CATHOLIC WOMEN PART OF THE VOTE. THEN YOU HAD A BALANCE OF PEOPLE ON THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE IN THE 1890s, WHENEVER IT WAS, SO THESE ISSUES HAVE BEEN BACK AND FORTH FOR A LONG, LONG TIME. WHY OTHER CITIES IN THE COMMONWEALTH HAVE NOT -- I DON'T

I DO KNOW THIS.

KNOW.

CHICAGO HAS HAD AN APPOINTED SCHOOL BOARD FOR A LONG, LONG TIME.

MY FRIEND CHAIRED THAT BOARD FOR THE MAYOR, THE FIRST OF MANY MAYOR DALEYS IN CHICAGO IN THE 1950s.

ROBERT WAGNER, AS I RECALL, CAME TO MY HOUSE ONCE FOR A COCKTAIL PARTY.

HE WAS CHAIRMAN OF THAT SCHOOL BOARD LIKE A GENERATION AFTER HIS FATHER WAS MAYOR, SO THE BIG CITIES HAVE HAD APPOINTED BOARDS, MANY OF THEM, FOR A LONG, LONG TIME.

>> IF I MAY ANSWER THAT QUESTION
AS WELL, I THINK IT WAS BECAUSE
OF HOW DYSFUNCTIONAL THE
13-MEMBER COMMITTEE WAS.
IT WAS UNTENABLE.
IT COULDN'T CONTINUE.
I REPRESENT THERE WERE FOUR
DIFFERENT ATTEMPTS -- WELL, NOT
ATTEMPTS.
THERE WERE FOUR PIECES OF
LEGISLATION PASSED TRYING TO

MAKE THE ELECTED STRUCTURE WORK
TO A POINT WHERE THE
SUPERINTENDENT IN BOSTON IS
PROBABLY THE MOST POWERFUL
SUPERINTENDENT IN THE COUNTRY AS
THESE EFFORTS WERE TRYING TO
FIND THE SUPERINTENDENT'S
AUTHORITY VIS-A-VIS THE SCHOOL
COMMITTEE AND JUST FOCUSING ON
EDUCATIONAL POLICY, BUT EVEN
WITH THAT, IT WASN'T ENOUGH,
WHICH IS WHAT LED MAYOR FLYNN TO
TAKE A LOOK AT THAT.

>> I GET THAT, BUT MY QUESTION IS WHY HAVEN'T -- IF THE BOSTON MODEL WOULD PROFFER BETTER EDUCATIONAL OUTCOMES, WHY HAVEN'T THE 350 CITIES AND TOWNS IN THE COMMONWEALTH ADOPTED THIS?

LARRY'S POINT IS WE ARE -- I WILL HAPPILY CONCEDE THE FACT WE ARE A LOT MORE COMPLICATED, LARGER BY FAR THAN ANY OTHER DISTRICT.

YET THERE ARE CERTAINLY SOME
LARGE DISTRICTS THERE.
THERE ARE CERTAINLY SOME
CHALLENGES THERE, PARTICULARLY
IN THE GATEWAY CITIES.
YET THE TRADEOFF SEEMS TO BE IN
MANY OF THESE CITIES OR TOWNS
HAVING THAT SORT OF DIRECT
REPRESENTATIVE OUTWEIGHS THE
FACT THERE STILL MAY BE SOME
ISSUES AND IT'S NOT PERFECT.
I GUESS THIS IS REALLY MORE OF
SORT OF AN INFORMATION GATHERING
PROCESS.

IF WHAT INDEED HAS BEEN ON THE BOOKS IN BOSTON FOR THE LAST 30 YEARS MAKES SO MUCH MORE SENSE, WHY ISN'T IT DONE ELSEWHERE? I WOULD ARGUE THAT MAYBE WE OUGHT TO BE LOOKING AT DOING THINGS A LITTLE BIT DIFFERENTLY.

>> IT IS DONE ELSEWHERE.
AS I SAID, THERE ARE OVER 20 --

>> I'M SPEAKING SPECIFICALLY ABOUT MASSACHUSETTS.

>> OKAY.

IT MAKES SENSE FOR A LARGE MUCH MORE COMPLEX DISTRICT.

>> FAIR POINT.

I WOULD BE INTERESTED TO SEE SORT OF THE MID 600, 700, EVEN TO 800,000 POPULATION CITIES AND WHAT THEY HAVE BECAUSE NEW YORK HAS 12 MILLION. CHICAGO HAS 3.5, 4 MILLION, MAYBE MORE THAN THAT. I DON'T KNOW WHAT THE L.A. MODEL IS, BUT WE'RE TALKING ABOUT THE MEGA CITIES COMPARED TO BOSTON. THAT'S ALL FOR NOW OTHER THAN I WOULD JUST SAY -- WELL, I WILL LEAVE IT AT THAT AND LET MY COLLEAGUES GO. THANK YOU. THANK YOU, MADAME CHAIR.

>> I WOULD LIKE TO RECOGNIZE
WE'VE BEEN JOINED BY COUNCILOR
LYDIA EDWARDS.
I JUST HAVE A QUICK QUESTION -WELL, HOPEFULLY, IT IS A QUICK
QUESTION WITH A SHORTER ANSWER.
ARE THERE WAYS IN YOUR OPINION
TO IMPROVE THE CURRENT APPOINTED
BODY WITHOUT MAKING IT ELECTED?

>> YES.

IF YOU WERE TO TAKE A LOOK AT THE APPOINTED BOARD IN THE EARLY YEARS, THAT WAS A BLUE RIBBON COMMITTEE. TOP PEOPLE BOTH IN TERMS OF PARENTS BUT ALSO BUSINESS,

EDUCATION.

THE NOMINATING PANEL JUST WENT THROUGH A PROCESS WHERE -- GINA ROBINSON AND JERRY'S ROBINSON'S TERMS WERE GOING TO EXPIRE AT THE END OF THIS YEAR, SO THERE WAS AN EFFORT TO TRY TO ENCOURAGE PEOPLE TO APPLY. THEY'RE BOTH INCUMBENTS, SO THAT PROBABLY STOPS SOME PEOPLE FROM APPLYING.
BUT OTHER THAN THEIR OWN APPLICATIONS, FOR TWO OPEN SEATS, THERE ARE ONLY SEVEN

OTHER NOMINATIONS. WE'VE GOT TO DO A BETTER JOB OF TRYING TO ENCOURAGE COMMUNITY-COMMITTED PEOPLE WHO WANT TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE IN EDUCATION AND HELP THE STUDENTS TO APPLY FOR THESE JOBS. THEN IT'S GOING TO BE INCUMBENT UPON THE MAYOR TO MAKE SURE THAT HE PICKS THE BEST PERSON FOR THAT JOB AND IT'S A PERSON HE SHOULD UNDERSTAND THAT HE IS BETTER SERVED BY HAVING A STRONG COMMITTED MEMBER OF THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE WHO MAY PUSH BACK BECAUSE OF THEIR OWN EXPERIENCE, BUT THAT'S GOING TO BE GOOD. THAT WILL BE BETTER FOR THE SYSTEM, SO WE CAN DO A BETTER JOB OF TRYING TO ENCOURAGE PEOPLE TO APPLY FOR THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE POSITION. WE CAN DO A BETTER JOB HOPING THAT THE MAYOR WILL TAKE THE BEST PERSON.

>> THANK YOU. LARRY? COUNCILOR BAKER?

>> DO YOU WANT TO ADD ANYTHING TO THAT, LARRY?

>> NO, I HAVE NOTHING TO ADD ON THAT.

>> ARE THERE ANY CITIES THAT HAVE CHANGED RECENTLY, LIKE BECOME APPOINTED IN THE LAST 15 OR 20 YEARS THAT MAY BE COMPARABLE TO BOSTON? ANYTHING THAT WE KNOW OF?

>> NO. SOON AFTER -- BOSTON WAS ONE OF THE FIRST.

>> YEAH.

>> BOSTON AND CHICAGO. AFTER THAT, MORE CITIES HAVE --

>> NEW YORK AFTER BOSTON?

>> YEAH, BUT SOON AFTER BOSTON, PROVIDENCE, RHODE ISLAND, ALSO MOVED TO AN APPOINTED BOARD, PHILADELPHIA ACTUALLY HAD AN APPOINTED BOARD BEFORE BOSTON. THAT WAS ORIGINALLY THE MODEL, BUT THE NOMINATING PROCESS WAS CHANGED BECAUSE THE PHILADELPHIA MODEL WOULD ALLOW THE MAYOR TO REJECT UNTIL HE GOT SOMEBODY THAT HE WANTED. THAT'S WHY THE NOMINATING PROCESS IS STRUCTURED THE WAY IT IS HERE, TO PROVIDE INDEPENDENCE BETWEEN THE PANEL AND THE MAYOR.

- >> THE MAYOR HAS FINAL SAY THOUGH.
- >> YEAH.
- >> ONLY RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE MAYOR.
- >> BUT HE HAS TO PICK FROM THE LIST OF NOMINEES THAT ARE PRESENTED BY THE NOMINATING PANEL.
 HE CAN'T REJECT THEM AND SAY I WANT MORE NAMES.
- >> ANNISSA ASKED WHAT I THOUGHT WAS A GOOD QUESTION.
 IF MAYBE GOING TO AN ELECTED OR A HYBRID ISN'T THE RIGHT MODEL, WHAT ELSE CAN WE DO WITHIN THIS STRUCTURE HERE?
 COULD WE ADD SEATS TO IT?
 COULD WE ADD A STUDENT.
 COULD WE ADD A PARENT SO IT
 WOULD GO UP THREE SEATS?
 COULD WE DO THINGS LIKE THAT?
- >> MEMBERS OF THE BOSTON SCHOOL COMMITTEE HAVE TO BE BOSTON REZ
- -- RESIDENTS, SO ANYBODY WHO IS A BOSTON RESIDENT CAN SUBMIT AN APPLICATION TO BE CONSIDERED FOR THE POSITION. A TEACHER ON THE COMMITTEE MAKING POLICY DECISION AFFECTING HIS OR HER OWN POSITION IS NOT --

THAT COULD BE A PROBLEM. I REPRESENT A DIFFERENT MUNICIPALITY. WE ACTUALLY HAD A DISCUSSION ABOUT THAT TODAY WHERE IN THIS CASE THE PERSON WOULD HAVE TO RECUSE THEMSELVES EACH TIME THERE WOULD BE SOMETHING THAT WOULD BE GERMANE. THAT WOULD BE A REAL PROBLEM BECAUSE ARGUABLY MOST EVERY VOTE THEY TAKE, CERTAINLY BUDGETARY MATTERS, WOULD IMPACT SOMEBODY WHO IS A TEACHER. YOU COULD HAVE A RETIRED TEACHER PROBABLY. WOULD NOT BE A CONFLICT.

>> THAT WOULD BE CONFLICT.

>> THAT WAS THE SAME AS THIS HERE. FOUR AT-LARGE AND NINE DISTRICTS.

>> I WORKED ON THAT IN THE LATE 70s, EARLY 80s. FROM THE CITY COUNCIL?

>> NO.

>> WE TRIED IT FROM THE CITY COUNCIL. WE DID NOT SUCCEED. THERE WAS A STATE LAW THAT WAS CRAFTED BY BILL GALVIN, SOMETIMES CALLED THE GALVIN BILL, WHICH WOULD ALLOW ANY PLAN A CITY WHO COULD BY REFERENDUM CHALLENGE THE CITY COUNCIL AND THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE SO THAT THERE WOULD BE ONE PERSON FOR EACH CERTAIN NUMBERS OF THE POPULATION AND FOUR AT-LARGE. I FORGET THE EXACT LANGUAGE, AND THAT FAILED IN '77 AND IT PASSED IN '81. THAT'S HOW WE HAD THAT BEGINNING WITH THE ELECTION OF '83. THAT'S ONE OF THE REASONS WE'VE HAD THE HIGHEST TURNOUT IN A CITY ELECTION. WE HAD OVER 200,000 PEOPLE VOTE THAT NOVEMBER IN THE CITY

ELECTION BECAUSE YOU HAD ALL THESE NEW SEATS BEING CREATED.

- >> IN YOUR OPINION, WHY DO YOU THINK IT WAS SO BAD, LIKE THE 13-MEMBER?
- >> THE PEOPLE WHO WERE ELECTED WERE MORE INTERESTED IN POLITICS THAN THEY WERE IN EDUCATION WITH A FEW EXCEPTIONS.
- >> YEAH.
- >> WITH ALL DUE RESPECT, PEOPLE WHO ARE FUNERAL DIRECTORS AND STUFF LIKE THAT, THESE ARE NOT NECESSARILY FOLKS WHO ARE INTERESTED IN EDUCATION. THEY'RE INTERESTED IN POLITICS. THE COMMITTEE AS A BODY WAS BRUTAL. SAM ATTENDED FAR MORE MEETINGS THAN I DID. THE MEETINGS WERE DYSFUNCTIONAL. THAT'S ONE OF THE REASONS YOU HAD THE SUCCESSION OF SUPERINTENDENTS, WHICH IS NOT GOOD FOR ANYBODY. WHEN WE HAD MORE STABILITY WITH THE APPOINTED COMMITTEE, WE HAD TOM AND CAROL JOHNSON COMBINED LIKE 17 YEARS BETWEEN THE TWO OF THEM.
- TOTALLY UNWIELDLY. IT DIDN'T WORK. THEY DIDN'T HAVE THE RIGHT PEOPLE FRANKLY. THAT'S ONE OF THE REASONS THAT THE RESEARCH BUREAU OPPOSED THE 13-MEMBER STRUCTURE FOR THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE. IT MADE A LOT OF SENSE FOR THE CITY COUNCIL BECAUSE PRIOR TO THAT THERE WERE WHOLE AREAS OF THE CITY THAT WERE NOT REPRESENTED, SO THE DISTRICT STRUCTURE ENSURED THAT EVERY NEIGHBORHOOD WOULD BE REPRESENTED WITH AT-LARGE MEMBERS, BUT UNFORTUNATELY IT

>> THE 13-MEMBER COMMITTEE WAS

WAS HITCHED TOGETHER.

>> HITCHED TOGETHER BY THE STATE LEGISLATION?

>> YEAH.
IT'S IMPORTANT, AND IT WORKS
WELL FOR THE CITY COUNCIL, BUT
FOR AN EDUCATIONAL POLICY BODY
IT WAS TOTALLY DYSFUNCTIONAL.

>> THEN WE WENT TO APPOINTED IN '83?

>> '92 WAS THE FIRST YEAR.

>> OKAY. THANK YOU, MADAME CHAIR.

>> THANK YOU, COUNCILOR.
THANK YOU TO THE TWO OF YOU FOR BEING HERE.

>> [OFF MIC].

>> WE DO HAVE ONE.
WHEN IT WENT TO APPOINTED, WAS
THERE LANGUAGE IN THERE FOR
CONFIRMATION ABILITY?
FOR THE CITY COUNCIL?

>> NO.

>> THERE WAS NEVER IN LANGUAGE IN THERE?

>> NO.
IT WAS INTENTIONAL TO ENSURE
THAT THE FULL ACCOUNTABILITY
WOULD BE ON THE MAYOR.

>> OKAY. THANK YOU.

>> COUNCILOR EDWARDS.

>> I'M GLAD YOU BROUGHT UP ACCOUNTABILITY. I APOLOGIZE FOR MISSING SO MUCH OF THE HEARING. I'VE BEEN LISTENING TO IT ONLINE BETWEEN MEETINGS, BUT I DID WANT TO GET BACK TO ACCOUNTABILITY TO THE PUBLIC. I THINK ONE OF THE BIGGEST
ISSUES HAS BEEN THAT PEOPLE FEEL
THAT THEY CAN BE SEEN, CAN SPEAK
AT LENGTH, AND THAT THERE CAN BE
NO REPERCUSSIONS FOR BEING
TOTALLY IGNORED BY THE SCHOOL
COMMITTEE.
IN MANY CASES, IN AN ELECTION OR

A PROCESS IN WHICH YOU MUST COME BEFORE THE PUBLIC AND PRESENT YOURSELF IS A PART OF ACCOUNTABILITY. HOW CAN WE ASSURE THAT THERE'S TRUE ACCOUNTABILITY FOR THE MEMBERS OF THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE, NOT THE MAYOR?

- >> WELL, IN THE END, THE MAYOR IS HELD ACCOUNTABLE.
- >> I KNOW, BUT THE MEMBERS OF THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE --
- >> THAT'S WHERE THE PRESSURE NEEDS TO BE SO THAT IT FILTERS DOWN TO THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE MEMBERS.

>> OKAY.

THERE IS NO WAY IN THE CURRENT STRUCTURE IS WHAT I'M HEARING TO HOLD THE MEMBERS ACCOUNTABLE DIRECTLY.

>> OTHER THAN ATTENDING SCHOOL COMMITTEE MEETINGS AND PUBLIC

COMMENT. LEGALLY NO.

>> OKAY.

>> CORRECT.

THE IDEA -- AND WE WERE BOTH INVOLVED IN THE EFFORTS IN THE LATE 80s AND EARLY 90s -- WAS TO HAVE THE MAYOR OWN THE SCHOOLS BECAUSE EVERYBODY KNOWS WHO THE MAYOR IS, AND THE MAYOR IS GOING TO BE ON THE BALLOT.
THE REALITY IS THAT AFTER A FEW YEARS A LOT OF MEMBERS OF THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE WEREN'T OPPOSED, WHICH MEANT THEY

WEREN'T VERY ACCOUNTABLE EITHER. IN THIS BODY, WHEN I WAS HERE, THEY WERE ANY PLACE FROM 23 TO 41 OF US RAN EVERY TWO YEARS. THAT SYSTEM YOU DID NOT A GOOD FAITH EFFORT FROM THE PARENTS FROM EAST BOSTON ON THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE.

THAT JUST DIDN'T SEEM TO HAPPEN FOR REASONS AS I SAID IN MY TESTIMONY -- I BELIEVE DEEP IN MY HEART IN ADDITION TO MAKING THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE MORE REPRESENTATIVE GEOGRAPHICALLY, RACE, GENDER, EVERYTHING ELSE THAT YOU WOULD IN FACT HAVE PEOPLE THAT THIS IS WHAT THEY CARED ABOUT AS OPPOSED TO RUNNING FOR THE COUNCIL OR FOR CLERK OF COURTS OR FOR SHERIFF, WHATEVER THE CASE MAY BE, WHICH IS WHAT PEOPLE IN THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE HAD DONE FOR DECADES. THAT DID NOT CHANGE WITH THE 13-MEMBER COMMITTEE.

>> I GUESS THE BACKWARDS WOULD BE THEN A PERSON NOT TAKING BOLD MOVES OR BEING ABLE TO BE OUT FRONT OR PROGRESSIVE TO PROTECT THEIR POSITION AS AN APPOINTEE ON THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE IS ENSURED BY THE FACT ONLY THE MAYOR CAN APPOINT THEM. YOU POINTED OUT THAT PEOPLE USE IT AS A POLITICAL STEPPINGSTONE TO GET ON SOMETHING ELSE. THEY WON'T CARE ABOUT EDUCATION OR EQUITY.

I WOULD ARGUE THEY HAVE THE SAME ISSUE.

THEY DON'T HAVE TO CARE EITHER WAY IF THEY'RE APPOINTED IF THEY DO THE BIDDING OF THE MAYOR AND DO EXACTLY WHAT HE SAYS REGARDLESS OF THE RESULTS, REGARDLESS OF THE ANGER, REGARDLESS OF THE ANGST OF THE PARENTS.

THERE'S A BALANCING ACT IN BOTH WAYS, I SUPPOSE.

>> FORGIVE ME IF YOU MAY OR MAY NOT HAVE BEEN LISTENING, THIS

HAS BEEN A DISCUSSION GOING ON FOR ABOUT 150 YEARS. WE'VE ONLY BEEN AROUND FOR ABOUT HALF OF IT.

>> THANK YOU.

>> THANK YOU, COUNCILOR EDWARDS. THANK YOU AGAIN TO THE TWO OF YOU FOR BEING HERE, FOR THE HISTORY LESSON BOTH THIS EVENING AND LEADING UP TO TONIGHT. THANK YOU. AT THIS POINT, JUST BEFORE THE SECOND PANEL COMES DOWN, I'D LIKE TO GIVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO THREE MORE FOLKS FOR PUBLIC TESTIMONY. DAMON, TESHAWN, AND MONTY.

>> THANK YOU FOR HAVING ME TODAY.

MY NAME IS DAMON.
I HAVE A DAUGHTER AT PRESCOTT.
I PERSONALLY DON'T WANT TO VOTE
FOR A SCHOOL COMMITTEE.
IT JUST ADDS PEOPLE TO AN
ALREADY CROWDED -- THEREFORE, I
DO NOT HAVE THE TIME TO PROPERLY
RESEARCH THE PEOPLE THAT I VOTE
FOR TODAY.

I PREFER TO HAVE THE MAYOR RESPONSIBLE AS A POINT OF CONTACT FOR COMPLAINTS OR PRAISE.

HOWEVER, THE SCHOOL IS
ULTIMATELY FORMED [INAUDIBLE].
EVERY TRANSITION TO MOVE SCHOOL
IS DISRUPTIVE FOR BOTH THE
STUDENT AND THE PARENT.
FOR THE STUDENTS, IT RESETS
RELATIONSHIPS AND LIKELY
INCREASES BULLYING.
FOR THE PARENTS, EVERY LOTTERY

DONE IS EXTREMELY STRESSFUL.
EVERY SCHOOL HAS A DIFFERENT
COST BENEFIT ANALYSIS BECAUSE
THEY HAVE DIDN'T START AND
ENDING TIMES, COMMUTES, AND
NUMBER OF GRADES.
OUR COMMUTES MUST CHANGE.
IF THE HOURS OF THE SCHOOL
CHANGE, WE HAVE TO MOVE OUT OF
BOSTON.

WE FELT ORIGINALLY THAT WE'D WON AS OUR CHILDREN HAD A SEAMLESS 1-8 BUT WITH THE PRESENT CHANGES, WE MAY BE FORCED OUT OF BOSTON. THANK YOU.

>> THANK YOU. MR. TINSLEY.

>> MY NAME IS TESHAWN.
I AM AN EDUCATOR AT AN
ELEMENTARY SCHOOL IN AN
OSTENSIBLY SEPARATE CLASSROOM.
IT MEANS TEACHING IN A SPECIAL
NEEDS CLASSROOM FOR THE BPS.
FOR ME, MY STUDENTS ARE MORE
THAN JUST MY STUDENTS.
THEY'RE MY FAMILY AWAY FROM MY
OWN.
EACH COMES FROM A DIFFERENT
BACKGROUND, AND EACH HAS A

BACKGROUND, AND EACH HAS A
DIFFERENT STORY TO TELL.
I'M HERE TO SPEAK FOR THEM AND
CHILDREN JUST LIKE THEM.
TRANSPORTATION ISSUES, SCHOOL
START TIMES, AND LACK OF
EDUCATIONAL VISION HAVE HINDERED
THE DEVELOPMENT NOT ONLY AT THE
SCHOOL LEVEL BUT AT THE
EXECUTIVE LEVEL.
ON MANY DAYS MY STUDENTS WHO ARE

ON MANY DAYS MY STUDENTS WHO ARD SUPPOSED TO HAVE DAY-TO-DAY HAVE SUFFERED FROM A LACK OF OVERSIGHT FROM THE BPS TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT AND HAVE MISSED THEIR BEST. I HAVE CUT INTO MY INSTRUCTION PURPOSELY IN ORDER TO ENSURE THEY START THEIR DAY WITH A GOOD MEAL.

I HAVE VISITED OTHER SCHOOLS,
AND THEY HAVE TOLD ME THIS
EXPERIENCE IS A SIMILAR
EXPERIENCE FOR THEM.
4,000 HOMELESS STUDENTS ACROSS
THE CITY OF BOSTON HAVE
SEEMINGLY BEEN OVERLOOKED.
WE HAVEN'T EVEN BEGAN TO ADDRESS
THE SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL TRAUMAS
THAT MANY STUDENTS ARE DEALING
WITH AT SUCH A YOUNG AGE.
IF IT WOULD PLEASE THE COUNCIL,
I WOULD LIKE TO SHOW SOMETHING.

I MEET STUDENTS AROUND THE BUILDING EVERY DAY GIVING HIGH-FIVES AND SHARING A LAUGH BEFORE GOING BACK TO THE CLASSROOMS.

ONE MORNING, AS I STOOD IN THE SCHOOL CAF, A FRIEND WALKED OVER TO ME.

HE SPOKE AND I COMMENTED ON HIS SWEATER.

HE MENTIONED HOW IT WAS GIVEN TO HIM BY HIS DAD, WHO MENTIONED HOW HE MISSED HIS FATHER WHO WAS, QUOTE, UP THERE.

BECAUSE HE HAD S SUBCOMBED TO THE VIOLENCE IN HIS NEIGHBORHOOD.
HE AND I SHARED A MOMENT BECAUSE I TOO LOST MY FATHER AT A VERY

HE MENTIONED HIS MOTHER BEING TOO BROKE FOR CHRISTMAS. IT WAS DISHEARTENING THE EMOTIONAL TRAUMA HE ALREADY ENDURED.

YOUNG AGE.

THE ONLY THING I COULD DO WAS TO ADVISE THE SCHOOL COUNSELOR OF THE SITUATION.

WE DESERVE REPRESENTATION THAT UNDERSTANDS THEM, THAT UNDERSTANDS THE CHALLENGES THAT EDUCATORS FACE BUT NOT JUST TO TEACH BUT TO INSPIRE.

AN APPOINTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE DOES NOT WORK FOR EVERY STUDENT OR THEIR FAMILIES.

THEIR VOICES ARE NOT OFTEN HEARD.

I URGE THE COUNCIL TO EMPOWER ACCOUNTABLE REPRESENTATIVE LEADERSHIP FOR OUR SCHOOLS NOT JUST BECAUSE OF OUR STUDENTS BUT BECAUSE FAMILIES DESERVE MORE THAN JUST BUSINESS AS USUAL. THANK YOU.

>> THANK YOU.
THANK YOU FOR BEING A TEACHER.
MONTY?

>> THANK YOU.
MY NAME IS MONTY.
I'M A MEMBER OF THE BOSTON
EDUCATIONAL JUSTICE ALLIANCE AND
THE BOARD OF CITIZENS FOR PUBLIC

SCHOOLS, AND I LIVE IN JAMAICA PLAIN.

THANK YOU FOR HOLDING THIS HEARING ON WHAT IS CURRENTLY A

VERY IMPORTANT MATTER.

BOSTON NEEDS TO RETURN TO A

DEMOCRATICALLY ELECTED SCHOOL

COMMITTEE.

THIS IS A DISCUSSION FRAUGHT

WITH A RATE OF GENERATIONS OF

STRUGGLES OVER RACE AND CLASS

AND WITH COMPLEX DIFFICULTIES

FACING BOSTON.

I DID A DISSERTATION ON THE

STRUGGLES OF THE BLACK COMMUNITY

IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS 1956 TO 1987.

IN IT, I EXPLORED THE TERRIBLE

HISTORY OF DEEP RACISM IN THE

SCHOOLS, HOW THE BLACK COMMUNITY

STRUGGLED TO END SEGREGATED

SCHOOLING AND TRANSFORM TEACHING

AND LEARNING AND WHY THESE

STRUGGLES HAD ONLY LIMITED

SUCCESS.

THE SHORT ANSWER WAS THE

CONTINUED VICTORY OF RACISM.

AT TIMES IN A SOFTER FORM OVER

THE NEEDS OF PUBLIC EDUCATION.

THOSE WERE THE KEY PROBLEMS OF

THE ELECTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE,

WHICH WERE ALSO FREQUENTLY RIFE

WITH INCOMPETENCE, EDUCATIONAL

IGNORANCE, OPPORTUNITYISM, AND

EVEN THIEVERY AS WE HEARD FROM

THE PREVIOUS PANEL.

THAT HISTORY WOULD SEEM TO --

HOWEVER, OVER THE YEARS WE HAVE

SEEN THE APPOINTED COMMITTEE

MAKE DECISIONS THAT ARE

EDUCATIONALLY UNSOUND, FAIL TO

FACE EQUITY BUT PERPETUATE

INEQUALITY, AND ARE NOT IN THE

INTEREST OF ANY PARENTS,

TEACHERS, STUDENTS, OR THE

COMMUNITY.

THE COMMITTEE HAVE SEEN FAR MORE

WILLING TO CORPORATE INTERESTS

OVER VOICES THAT MUST BE MOST

HEARD.

I'VE STUDIED EDUCATION ACROSS

THE COUNTRY IN MY WORK AS A

FORMER DIRECTOR.

I CAN TELL YOU THAT KIND OF

TERRIBLE APPOINTED COMMITTEE HAS

CERTAINLY BEEN TRUE IN NEW YORK CITY AND CHICAGO.
BECAUSE OF CHANGE OF DEMOGRAPHICS IN THE QUARTER CENTURY SINCE THE START OF THE COMMITTEE, INCLUDING THE HUGE GROWTH IN LATINX AND OTHER IMMIGRANT GROUPS, THE ELECTORAL LANDSCAPE OF THIS CITY HAS CHANGED.
I BELIEVE THAT THE CITY COUNCIL THAT ITS COMPOSITION AND ITS

I BELIEVE THAT THE CITY COUNCIL
THAT ITS COMPOSITION AND ITS
VOTING COMES CLOSER TO
REPRESENTING THIS NEW BOSTON.
I BELIEVE THAT AN ELECTED SCHOOL
COMMITTEE WILL NOW DO THE SAME.
IN ADDITION, THE BOSTON SCHOOL
COMMITTEE NEEDS A VOTING STUDENT
REPRESENTATION.

IT WOULD BE FAR MORE RESPONSIVE TO THE NEEDS OF THE PEOPLE WHO THE SCHOOL SYSTEM IS INTENDED TO SERVE.

IT WILL NOT BE A PANACEA, BUT IT WILL PROVIDE THE SPACE AND OPPORTUNITY FOR ACTIVE COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT AND FOR EDUCATIONAL PROGRESS THAT THE APPOINTED COMMITTEE HAS NOT DONE AND SHOWS NO SIGNS IT WILL DO. IT IS TIME FOR A CHANGE. IT IS TIME TO STRENGTHEN AND EXPAND DEMOCRACY, AND IT IS TIME FOR THE CITY OF BOSTON TO HAVE AN ELECTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE. THANK YOU.

>> THANK YOU, MONTY.

>> NOW I WOULD LIKE TO CALL DOWN OUR SECOND PANEL.

WHETHER ANOTHER GOVERNING STRUCTURE COULD LEAD TO MORE ACCOUNTABILITY FOR THE ACTIONS OF OUR SCHOOL COMMITTEE MEMBERS AND WHETHER WE SHOULD HAVE THAT MECHANISM IN PLACE HERE IN BOSTON.

I THINK IT'S ALSO WORTHY TO NOTE THAT ONE OF OUR SPEAKERS LIVES IN THE CITY OF HOLE BROOK WITH ELECTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE. THE PARTICIPATION OF OUR PARENTS

THE PARTICIPATION OF OUR PARENTS AND COMMUNITY STAKEHOLDERS IN DECISION MAKING PROCESS IS

LIMITED TO TWO OFFICIAL AVENUES.

FIRST BEING PARTICIPATION IN

SCHOOL COMMITTEE MEETINGS.

THE SECOND BY A VOTE FOR THE

MAYOR TO APPOINT THESE MEMBERS.

IN TRYING TO UNDERSTAND

CONTEXTUALIZE HOW MUCH POWER AND

CHOICE REALLY EXISTS I'LL OFFER

YOU THREE VIGNETTES.

THERE ARE THREE INSTANCES WHERE

I WONDER IF SCHOOL COMMITTEE

MEMBERS MIGHT HAVE CONDUCTED

THEY WILL SELF DIFFERENTLY IF

THEY WERE HELD ACCOUNTABLE BY

LOCAL ELECTIONS.

THE FIRST, ON OCTOBER 23, 2015,

THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE SIGNED AN

AGREEMENT TO OFFER SEVERANCE

PACKAGES TO TEACHERS THAT WERE

OCCUPYING SUITABLE POSITIONS OF

THOSE OVER 00 TEACHERS,

CHARACTERIZE AS TEACHERS OF

COLOR, BLACK AND OF HAVING BEEN

EVALUATED AS PROFICIENT OR

EXEMPLARY.

AT THE SAME TIME, BPS WAS IN

NONCOMPLIANCE WITH THE FEDERAL

COURT ORDER REQUIRING 5% OF THE TEACHING FACULTY BE BLACK, AT

THAT TIME WE WERE LESS THAN 21%.

NOTWITHSTANDING THE NEEDS OF

DIVERSIFY, NECESSITATING THE

HIRING OF MORE TEACHERS OF CO

COLOR, THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE REQUIRED THAT IN A SEVERANCE

PACKAGE OFFERS TO THESE TEACHERS

IN EXCHANGE FOR RIGHT TO

POSITION THAT THEY NEVER APPLY

FOR A POSITION WITHIN BPS IN THEIR LIVES.

EXCEPT AS SUBSTITUTE.
THESE WERE WELL SEASONED
EDUCATORS WITH YEARS OF
EXPERIENCE.
WHO HAD BEEN EVALUATED
ALTERNATES A MINIMUM AT
PROFICIENT AND REQUIRE THAT THEY
LEAVE THE SYSTEM NEVER ABLE TO
APPLY.
THIS DOCUMENT WAS SIGNED BY OUR

THIS DOCUMENT WAS SIGNED BY OUR SCHOOL COMMITTEE.

A SCHOOL COMMITTEE MEMBER IN CITED BY RACIAL ANIMUS YELLED AT A PARENT, DISPARAGING THEM BASED ON RACE AT A OPEN MEETING AND PERCEIVED ECONOMIC STATUS OF THIS PARENT.

THE THIRD EXAMPLE WAS A SURPRISING AND AVOIDABLE ERROR HOW SCHOOL -- THESE SCHOOL ASSIGNMENT SYSTEM WAS IMPLEMENTED FOR SIXTH GRADE.

FAMILIES ARE SUPPOSED TO HAVE

ACCESS TO TWO TEAR ONE BUT ALGORITHM WAS SET TO SET BASIS.

AS RESULT SCHOOLS THAT DIDN'T OFFER 6th GRADE WERE REMOVED FROM THE LIST OF SCHOOLS THAT

PARENTS COULD CHOOSE.

CONSEQUENTLY THIS MEANT THAT NO TEAR ONE REMAIN WHO WERE

ULTIMATELY REPRESENTED BY BLACK AND BROWN CHILDREN.

THAT ALGORITHM WAS REQUIRED TO BE AUDITED EVERY YEAR HAD IN THE BEEN AUDITED FOR FOUR.

CAUSING ARGUABLY HARM TO THESE FAMILIES.

THAT WAS SCHOOL COMMITTEE RESPONSIBILITY.

THESE THREE EXAMPLES PROVIDE
INSTANCES WHERE CONDUCT BY
SCHOOL MITT TEE MEMBERS WERE THE
PROXIMATE CAUSE OF POOR
REPRESENTATION OF THE VALUES OF
OUR SCHOOL SYSTEM AND POLICIES
THAT NOT ONLY POTENTIALLY
CAUSE -- EXCUSE ME, HARM TO OUR

CHILDREN BUT MADE IT MORE DIFFICULT OF SCHOOL DEPARTMENT TO MEET OBLIGATION TO DIVERSIFY

AS ORDERED AND ACHIEVE ITS MISSION.

THIS CONSEQUENTLY LEAVES MANY TO

WONDER IF AN ELECTED BODY WOULD YIELD DIFFERENT RESULTS. DIFFERENT DECISIONS MADE ON THESE POLICIES COULD RESIDENTS MORE EASILY REMOVE A SCHOOL COMMITTEE MEMBER, MOTIVATED BY RACIAL AND ECONOMIC BIAS. COULD PARENTS FIND MORE DIGNITY. AS FAR AS WE'RE CONCERNED ACCOUNTABILITY IN THE DECISION MAKING PROCESS AND EQUITABLE OUTCOMES FOR CHILDREN WHO IS MOST IMPORTANT IN THIS PROCESS. WE ARE WILLING TO SUPPORT THE GOVERNING STRUCTURE THAT MOST EFFICIENTLY, EQUITABLY AND WITH GREATEST DEFERENCE TO THE WELL BEING OF OUR CHILDREN AND RELATIONSHIPS WITH THEIR PARENTS ACHIEVES THE GOALS AND MISSION OF THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS. IN ADDITION, HISTORICALLY ENFRANCHISEMENT HAS NEVER RESTED ON SOMEONE'S ABILITY TO PASS A TEST OR SOMEONE'S ABILITY TO PAY A TAX. OR OF THEIR DEMONSTRATION OF A THEIR ABILITY TO MAKE A GOOD CHOICE. OR HOW THE FIELD OF CANDIDATES MIGHT BE OR HOW CONTENTIOUS THE DECISION WOULD BE. THE EXPECTED OUTCOME OF VOTER PARTICIPATION. AS A MATTER OF FACT THESE WERE OFTEN THE PRETEXT TO ENSURE DISENFRANCHISEMENT OF MARGINALIZED PEOPLE. THE PARADE OF HORRIBLES OFFERED TONIGHT COULD POSSIBLY BE DEALT WITH BY BEING CAREFUL IN THE LEGISLATION AND THE WAYS IN WHICH WE MOVE FORWARD. AS ALWAYS, THE BOSTON BRANCH OF THE NAACP STANDS BY ITS MISSION TO MAKE SURE THAT EOUITY FOR ALL CHILDREN IS ACHIEVED ESPECIALLY

>> THANK YOU FOR HOSTING THAT HEARING. I AM THE DIRECTOR OF THE BOSTON **EDUCATION JUSTICE ALLIANCE** COALITION OF PARENTS. STUDENTS AND TEACHERS WORKING TO SUPPORT PUBLIC EDUCATION IN BOSTON. EVERY SINGLE CITY AND TOWN FALL IN STATE WHY NOT BOSTON. ALONG THE SAME LINES I'D LIKE TO OFFER VIGNETTE THAT HAPPENED LAST WEEK ON WEDNESDAY DECEMBER 5th. I WAS AT THE BUILDING UNTIL MIDNIGHT. LISTENING TO THE BACK AND FORTH OF SCHOOL COMMITTEE MEMBERS TALK ABOUT THE DIFFICULTY OF MAKING THE DECISION TO CLOSE WEST ROXBURY EDUCATIONAL COMPLEX. THIS HI HAVE TO DECIDE THE FATE OF 690 STUDENTS ON DECEMBER 19th THEY ASKED BPS ADMINISTRATION QUESTIONS WANTING MORE INFORMATION, DATA AND OPTIONS. MADE UP OF SEVEN VOTING MEMBERS, CONTRACT WHO STEPPED DOWN FROM HER POST. ALEX, DR. COLEMAN REMARKS GINA ROBINSON, JERRY ROBINSON AND MICHAEL O'NEILL. EVELYN REYES IS THE STUDENT ADVISORY SHE HAS NO VOTING PRIVILEGE.

IN ITS ABSENCE THE SEVEN NOW SIX PEOPLE ARE GIVEN THE TASK OF SHUTTING DOWN A SCHOOL AND DISBURSING STUDENTS TO WHEREVER THERE IS SPACE.

THE SEVEN MEMBERS TRIED TO MAKE SENSE OF THE MESS IN ORDER TO

MAKE THE BEST DECISIONS.

THEY HAVE SHARED HOW THEY STAYED AWAKE THINKING WHAT THEY SHOULD BE DO, LISTENED TO PARENTS, STUDENTS, TEACHERS AND SO MANY COMMUNITY VOICES UNANIMOUSLY AND

RESOUNDINGLY DEMAND NOT TO HARM OUR CHILDREN.

OUR PUBLIC EDUCATION AND FOR SCHOOL COMMUNITIES TO STAY TOGETHER.

THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE ASKED HARD QUESTION, SPOKEN UP AND ON

BEHALF OF OUR STUDENTS. SCHOOL COMMITTEE MEMBERS REFERENCE THE PARTHENON REPORT WHICH SHOWED RESEARCH THAT 91% OF STUDENTS WHO ENTERED SCHOOL IN 9th GRADE STAYED FOR THEIR ENTIRE HIGH SCHOOL CAREER GRADUATED IN FOUR YEARS. HOWEVER, 35% OF STUDENTS WHO **EVENTUALLY TRANSFERRED TO** ANOTHER HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATED IN FOUR YEARS. SCHOOL COMMITTEE MEMBERS EMPHATICALLY UNDERSTAND THAT THEY WILL BE DIRECTLY RESPONSIBLE FOR THE DROP OUT OF OVER 287 STUDENTS WITH THIS ONE DECISION. THAT DOES NOT INCLUDE GENERATIONS OF YOUNG PEOPLE WHO WILL FOLLOW THEIR PARENTS' LEAD IN DROPPING OUT. HOWEVER, ON DECEMBER 19th, THEY WILL VOTE. MOST LIKELY TO CLOSE WEST ROXBURY AND DISPERSE STUDENTS WHEREVER BPS HAS FIRST CHOICE. WHY, BECAUSE THEY ALMOST ALWAYS VOTE TO UNANIMOUSLY PASS WHATEVER IS PUT BEFORE THEM. THAT IN ESSENCE IS WHAT IS FLAWED ABOUT APPOINTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE. SEVEN LONG TIME RESIDENTS, PROFESSIONALS, PEOPLE DEDICATED TO EDUCATION TRYING TO DO WHAT IS BEST FOR BOSTON'S CHILDREN, TEACHERS AND PARENTS BUT CONSISTENTLY VOTE WHAT THEY HAVE BEEN APPOINTED TO VOTE. WE KNOW THAT MAYOR WALSH ULTIMATELY SELECTS COMMITTEE MEMBERS," RIM SYSTEM AND CHOICE OF TOMMY CHANG, THE MAYOR PUSHES IN A PARTICULAR DIRECTION AND SCHOOL COMMITTEE RESPONDS ACCORDINGLY. ALL OUR COMMUNITIES CAN DO IS PROVIDE TESTIMONY, MEET WITH ELECTED OFFICIALS WHO HAVE NO DIRECT SAY OVER THE SCHOOLS, HOPE THAT AN UNDEMOCRATICALLY SELECTED COMMITTEE HIS EBBS TO THOSE WHO SHOULD BE ITS REAL CONSTITUENTS AND HOPE THAT DECISION BY AN APPOINTED GROUP REPRESENTS THEIR BEST INTERESTS. BEST PART OF OUR CITY.

THE FEAR OF AN ELECTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE IS ROOTED IN A VERY PRESENT HISTORY OF RACE IN **BOSTON BUT DEMOGRAPHICS HAVE** CHANGED SINCE THE START OF THE APPOINTED COMMITTEE.

ELECTION OF SIX WOMEN OF COLOR TO THE CITY COUNCIL INCLUDING THREE ELECTED CITY WIDE AS WELL AS THE ELECTION TO CONGRESS SHOWS WHEN IT COMES TO VOTING **BOSTON IS OUT GROWING ITS PAST** HISTORY OF RACE RIOTS AND SEGREGATION.

HOWEVER, OUR NEIGHBORHOODS

CONTINUE TO BE DIVIDED BY RACE AND CLASS. ACCORDING TO THE BOSTON PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT AGENCY IN 015. IMMEDIATE I CAN'T BE FAMILY INCOME WAS 26K WHILE MEDIAN IN NEWLY INVESTED SEAPORT AREA WAS 111K. THE STATISTICS BY ONLY HIGHLIGHTED THE DISTURB CAN RACIAL IMPLICATIONS WITH BLACK BOSTONIANS HAVE MEDIAN NET WORTH OF \$8 IN COMPARISON TO THE MEDIAN NET WORTH OF \$47,500. SO WE KNOW THAT RACE IS A FACTOR IN HOW THE CITY IS DIVIDED. I RAISE THIS POINT BECAUSE COMMUNITY, PARENT AND CIVIL RIGHTS GROUP WHO MOST REPRESENT THESE COMMUNITIES ARE IN FAVOR OF AN ELECTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE. IT IS THE CORPORATE ELITE WHO MOST BENEFIT FROM THE HARSH INEQUITY IN BOSTON THAT ACCORDING TO TODAY'S BOSTON GLOBE MOST SUPPORTS UNELECTED. UNDEMOCRATIC SCHOOL COMMITTEE. WE PROPOSE ELECTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE HAVE STRUCTURE SIMILAR TO THAT OF THE CITY COUNCIL WHICH THERE ARE SEVERAL CITY-WIDE SEATS AS WELL AS NEIGHBORHOOD SPECIFIC. IN ADDITION WE SUPPORT ADDING MUCH NEEDED VOTING YOUTH REPRESENTATIVES. THE BOSTON EDUCATION JUSTICE ALLIANCE BELIEFS IN DEMOCRACY AND CONCLUDES IT MAKES SENSE AT

MOST IMPORTANT DUTY THE CARE AND

EDUCATION OF OUR CHILDREN.

AS A TEACHER AND 18 YEARS AS A DISTRICT WIDE ADMINISTRATOR, I AM HERE TO PRESENT AS PRESIDENT OF BOSTON EDUCATORS ALLIANCE OF MASSACHUSETTS OUR STATEMENT AND MY THANK YOU FOR THIS OPPORTUNITY TO SHARE THE POSITION ON THIS VERY IMPORTANT ISSUE.

WE BELIEVE THAT THE GOVERNANCE OF BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS IS BROKEN.

THE MAYORAL POINTED BOSTON SCHOOL COMMITTEE HAS FAILED TO DELIVER EQUITABLE EDUCATION TO ALL BOSTON STUDENTS.

IT IS TIME TO RESTORE AN ELECTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE TO BOSTON AS IN EVERY OTHER CITY AND TOWN IN MASSACHUSETTS.

I'M SURE WE CAN ALL AGREE THAT THE MOST IMPORTANT CHARGE FOR ANY SCHOOL COMMITTEE HAS BEEN STATED IS TO ENSURE THAT THE SCHOOL THEY GOVERN PROVIDE QUALITY EDUCATION FOR ALL STUDENTS.

HOWEVER DESPITE THE PROMISES OF AN APPOINTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE THAT EDUCATION WOULD IMPROVE ALL STUDENTS IN BOSTON, BPS REMAINS AMONG THE LOWEST RANKS OF SCHOOL DISTRICTS IN MASSACHUSETTS.
ACCORDING TO LATEST STATE ACCOUNTABILITY DATA, BPS HAS 49 SCHOOLS IN NEED OF EITHER FOCUS OR BROAD SUPPORT FROM THE STATE. OPPORTUNITY AND ACHIEVEMENT GAPS PERSIST FOR STUDENTS OF COLOR, STUDENTS WHO ARE ENGLISH LEARNERS AND STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES.

LIKE SCHOOL COMMITTEES IN EVERY OTHER TOWN IN MASSACHUSETTS, THE BOSTON SCHOOL COMMITTEE TAKES ITS DIRECTION FROM THE MAYOR NOT FROM THE PARENTS OR OTHER CITIZENS.

THE MAYOR APPOINTS SCHOOL COMMITTEE MEMBERS AND THEY RESPOND PRIMARILY TO THE MAYOR. OR MAJOR ISSUES THAT DRIVE QUALITY OF EDUCATION SUCH AS BUDGET AND FACILITIES, THE MAYOR MAKES DECISION IN THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE DUTIFULLY FOLLOWS THEM DESPITE THE EXPRESSED WISHES OF PARENTS, STUDENTS, OTHER CITIZENS AND OFTEN THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE MEMBERS THEMSELVES. WE KNOW THAT RECENTLY PARENTS. STUDENTS, BPS STAFF BY THE HUNDREDS HAVE PROTESTED TO THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE OVER BUDGET CUTS TO SCHOOLS, SCHOOL CLOSURES AND OTHER ISSUES AS MY COLLEAGUES HAVE STATED. THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE HAS LISTENED TO THESE PROTESTS AND HEARINGS AND FORUMS BUT HAVE LARGELY IGNORED THEM AS THEY HAVE VOTED THE MAYOR'S WISHES. THE BOSTON SCHOOL COMMITTEE CAN DISREGARD THE VOICES OF BOSTON CITIZENS BECAUSE IT IS DIRECTLY ACCOUNTABLE TO THE MAYOR AND NOT VOTERS. AGAIN. UNLIKE SCHOOL COMMITTEES IN EVERY OTHER CITY AND TOWN IN MASSACHUSETTS. BOSTON CITIZENS NO LONGER ELECT MEMBERS OF THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE. VOTERS IN BOSTON CANNOT DIRECTLY ELECT TO THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE PEOPLE WHO REPRESENT THEIR **EDUCATIONAL PRIORITIES AND** CONCERNS. VOTERSER ALSO CANNOT REMOVE SCHOOL COMMITTEE MEMBERS WHO TAKE ACTIONS CONTRARY TO THE INTERESTS OF THE VOTERS, WHY SHOULD BOSTON, A LARGE URBAN CITY WITH MAJORITY POPULATION OF PEOPLE OF COLOR BE THE ONLY CITY TOTALLY DISENFRANCHISED FROM THIS DEMOCRATIC PROCESS. SINCE 1991, BOSTON HAS HAD SCHOOL COMMITTEES APPOINTED BY MAYORS OF THE CITY. NEARLY THREE DECADES IS SUFFICIENT TIME FOR THE APPOINTED SCHOOL COMMITTEES TO HAVE DEMONSTRATED THAT THEY COULD DELIVER QUALITY EDUCATION TO ALL BOSTON RESIDENTS.

THEY HAVE NOT.

IT IS TIME TO RESTORE TO BOSTON CITIZENS THE RIGHTS ENJOYED BY

CITIZENS OF ALL OTHER MASSACHUSETTS CITIES AND TOWNS. BOSTON CITIZENS ARE COMPETENT TO ELECT A MAYOR. A CITY COUNCIL AND A HOST OF OTHER STATE AND FEDERAL OFFICIALS. SURELY THEY ARE COMPETENT TO ELECT MEMBERS OF THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE. IN CLOSING, WE REITERATE THAT THE DATA SHOWS THAT THE APPOINTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE HAS FAILED TO DEMONSTRATE IMPROVEMENT IN THE EDUCATIONAL **OUTCOMES FOR ALL BPS STUDENTS** AND HAS DISENFRANCHISED PARENTS OVER AND OVER AGAIN FOR THE PAST 30 YEARS.

NEARLY 30 YEARS. IN ORDER TO SAVE CURRENT AND FUTURE GENERATIONS OF BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS FROM BEING CONDEMNED TO MEDIOCRE EDUCATIONAL ANOTHER OUTCOMES THAT ILL-PREPARES THEM FOR THE PROFESSIONS OF THE FUTURE AND TO GIVE BPS STUDENTS, PARENTS AND CITIZENS INCLUDING THOSE WHO SERVE AS TEACHERS. ADMINISTRATORS AND STAFF IN THIS GREAT CITY OF BOSTON, DECISION MAKING PROCESS, THE TIME IS NOW FOR AN ELECTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE. THANK YOU.

>> THANK YOU, EDITH. MARY.

>> GOOD EVENING, MY NAME IS MA MARY. I HAVE BEEN BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOL PARENT SINCE 2000 WHEN MY OLDEST ENTERED YOUNG ACHIEVERS AS K1 STUDENT I'M A MEMBER OF THE GRASS ROOTS PARENT GROUP QUEST, QUALITY EDUCATION FOR EVERY STUDENT. AND RESIDENT OF JAMAICA PLAIN AND PROUD TO BE REPRESENTED BY COUNCILOR O'MALLEY. THANK YOU FOR HOLDING THAT HEARING AND FOR YOUR ADVOCACY ON BEHALF OF BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS. WE'RE HERE BECAUSE WE CURRENTLY DON'T HAVE A CHANCE TO ELECT OUR SCHOOL COMMITTEE.

BUT YOU AS OUR CITY COUNCILORS HAVE FREQUENTLY RAISED YOUR VOICES TO SAD SLOW KATE FOR OUR STUDENTS AND FAMILY, I AND OTHER PARENTS APPRECIATE THE LISTENING TOURS AND OTHER COMMUNITY GROUPS I PARTICULARLY WANT TO THANK COUNCILOR EDWARDS FOR COMING OUT ON A COLD, RAINY NIGHT THE MONDAY AFTER THANKSGIVING TO CURTIS HALL TO MEET WITH QUEST WHEN WE HELD A MEETING. I ALSO APPRECIATE THE PUBLIC STATEMENTS SUCH AS THE ONE READ AT LAST WEEK'S SCHOOL COMMITTEE ON THE BUILD BPS PLAN. BUT THAT INDIRECT INFLUENCE, IMPORTANT AS IT IS IS A MITIGATING FACTOR DOES NOT CHANGE THE FACT THAT AN ENTIRELY APPOINTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE DI **DISENFRANCHISES PARENTS AND** GIVES TOO MUCH MR. POWER TO THE MAYOR. CITY HALL AND BPS MAKE DECISIONS WITHOUT ANY PRIOR NOTICE MUCH LESS COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT. THROUGH RECENT EXAMPLES OF THIS ARE THE FORCED DEPARTURE OF DR DR. CHANG, ATTEMPT TO INSTITUTE UNIFIED CHARTER DISTRICT ENROLLMENT LOTTERY AND LACK OF OVERSIGHT OF THE HOME BASED STUDENT ASSIGNMENT SYSTEM WITH THE PROBLEMS HIGHLIGHTED BY MR MR. LOPEZ. THE DISTRICT.

AS A RESULT EXPERIMENTS ARE BLINDSIDED AND COME TO DISTRUST

FAMILY ENGAGEMENT COMES TO MEAN PR MESSAGING TO GET PARENTS ON BOARD WITH ALREADY DETERMINED PLAN RATHER THAN A GENUINE SHARED DECISION-MAKING PROCESS. THUS, AB APPOINTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE HAS DEMONSTRABLY NEGATIVE IMPACT ON FAMILY AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT. IT'S AT ODDS WITH DEMOCRACY AND GIVEN THAT 86% OF BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS ARE BLACK, ASIAN OR LATINO, IT IS AT ODDS WITH RACIAL EQUITY. IT'S FUNDAMENTALLY CLASHES WITH

THE TENAMENT EXPRESSED BY AYANNA PRESSLEY THAT, QUOTE, THE PEOPLE CLOSEST TO THE PAIN SHOULD BE CLOSEST TO THE POWER DRIVING AND INFORMING OUR POLICY MAKING. FOR A LONG TIME I HAVE BEEN ON THE FENCE AND QUEST HAD NOT TAKEN POSITION. HOWEVER, AFTER SO MANY YEARS OF SEEING THE PEOPLE CLOSEST TO THE PAIN SHUT OUT OF ANY DECISIONS AFFECTING OUR CHILDREN, OF WA WATCHING HELPLESSLY AS BOSTON SCHOOL COMMITTEE MAKES CHOICES THAT GO AGAINST CLEARLY EXPRESSED WISHES AND BEST INTERESTS OF FAMILY AND ST STUDENTS, THAT'S GOTTEN ME OFF THE FENCE. I'M FIRMLY IN FAVOR OF BOSTON JOINING THE 98 TO 99% OF THE REST OF THE COUNTRY AND ALLOWING OUR COMMUNITY TO ELECT THE PEOPLE WHO TAKE CARE OF OUR SCHOOLS AND THROUGH THEM OUR CHILDREN. THE VOICES OF PEOPLE CLOSEST TO THE PAIN NOT BUSINESS OR POLITICAL LEADERS WHO SIT ABOVE IT SHOULD ELECT OUR CITY SCHOOL LEADERS.

MOST RECENTLY AS YOU HAVE HEARD THE VOICES CLOSEST TO THE PAIN HAS BEEN PARENTS, TEACHERS AND STUDENTS OF THE McCORMICK MIDDLE SCHOOL AND WEST ROXBURY EDUCATION COMPLEX.
LISTENING TO THEM SPEAKING IN SPANISH OR IN THE HALTING ELOQUENT TONES OF A STUDENT ON THE AUTISM SPECTRUM I AM STRUCK BOTH BY THE POWER OF THOSE TESTIMONIES AND BY OUR POWERLESSNESS.
WE LACK THE POWER TO DO WHAT

STATE REPRESENTATIVE CHARLES IA IANELLO DID NOT TO BE CONFUSED WITH CHRIS AFTER WHOM? CHAMBER IS NAMED.
THEN SUPERINTENDENT PROPOSED CLOSING 20 SCHOOLS AS COST SAVING.
THE PERPESENTATIVE WITH PARENTS

THE REPRESENTATIVE WITH PARENTS, STUDENTS AND ALUMS FROM BOSTON

CLERICAL, DORCHESTER HIGH SCHOOL FOR GIRLS AND OLIVER WENDELL HOLMES PETITIONED THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE.

THEY VOWED TO, QUOTE, WORK FOR THE DEFEAT IN THIS FALSE ELECTION OF SCHOOL COMMITTEE MEMBERS WHO FAVOR THE SCHOOL CLOSING.

NOT ONLY DO WE LACK ANY REAL MECHANISM TO HOLD CITY HALL AND BPS FOR CRITICAL DECISIONS BUT SCHOOL COMMITTEE MEMBERS THEMSELVES MAY BE HOBBLED FROM DOING WHAT THEY THINK IS RIGHT. THE APPOINTED SYSTEM MAKES THEM AND NONPROFIT OR ORGANIZATIONS DEPENDENT UPON THE MAYOR. POLITICS REMAINS VERY MUCH AT PLAY.

BUT IT'S POLITICS IN THE NEGATIVE SENSE OF INFLUENCE AND PAY TREE -- TAKE TRONNAGE TO THE POSITIVE POTENTIAL OF ELECTORAL POLITICS, POTENTIAL THEME IN SO MANY LOCAL AND NATIONAL RACES

THIS FALL. I AM SO PROUD THAT FORMER ELECTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE MEMBER, I ASK HER PERMISSION, I HAVE A QUOTE FROM HER IN HERE. SHE SAID THIS IN 1996, DURING THE REFERENDUM BATTLE OVER THE ELECTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE. IT REALLY CONCERNS ME THAT WE WOULD GIVE UP IN BOSTON WHAT WE DUMPED TEA IN BOSTON HARBOR FOR. THEN SHE ADDED THIS IS REFERRING TO THE BILL CLINTON CAMPAIGN, IT'S DEMOCRACY, STUPID. I WAS ASKED TO SPEAK HERE AS PARENT AND MEMBER OF QUEST BUT ALSO HISTORY PROFESSOR FOR MANY YEARS NOW AT BOSTON UNIVERSITY

TAKE ON IT.
BUT BEFORE WRITING THESE
COMMENTS, I DO WHAT I ALWAYS DO
IN SPEAKING TO UNDERSTAND AN
ISSUE I LISTEN TO PARENTS AND
COMMUNITY MEMBERS AND RESEARCH

AND AT SOME POINT I WOULD BE HAPPY TO SPEAK ABOUT THE 19th CENTURY HISTORY THAT COUNCILOR GAVE BECAUSE I HAVE A DIFFERENT

THE HISTORY. THE DOMINANT NARRATIVE OF DYSFUNCTIONAL SCHOOL COMMITTEE IN THE '50S AND '80S IS NOT ENTIRELY NEW ORLEANS NOR IS THE THE WHOLE STORY. PARTICULARLY IT'S IMPORTANT TO ACKNOWLEDGE THAT BLACK ELECTED OFFICIALS IN COMMUNITIES OF COLOR LARGELY OPPOSE AN APPOINTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE. IN 1989 THE CITY COUNCIL VOTED 10-2 FOR AN APPOINTED BOARD. THE TWO NO VOTES WERE THE TWO AFRICAN AMERICAN COUNCILORS. AFTER WHOM IRONICALLY IN THE CONTEXT THAT HAVE VOTE SCHOOL COMMITTEE HEADQUARTERS ARE NA NAMED. THE BLACK PARENT LEADER AT THAT TIME HEAD OF THE CITY WIDE PARENT COUNCIL VOTED ALSO ADVOCATED VOTED AGAINST THE BOARD BECAUSE IT GIVES COMPLETE CONTROL TO THE MAYOR FOR WHATEVER HE WANTS TO DO. THE STATE LEGISLATURE, MANY **BLACK AND HISPANIC** REPRESENTATIVES VOTED AGAINST A PETITION FOR APPOINTED BOARD. MR. TYLER SPOKE ABOUT THE ELECTION RESULTS WITH AGGREGATE FIGURES, MISS HAD IS REALLY HAPPENING AT MORE DEEP LEVEL, IN BOTH 1991 AND 1996 WOULD SHOW YOU THAT RACE WAS STRONGEST PREDICTOR OF SUPPORT FOR AN ELECTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE, WITH VOTERS IN PREDOMINANTLY BLACK WARDS FAR MORE LIKELY TO FAVOR AN ELECTED COMMITTEE. I THINK, DON'T QUOTE ME BECAUSE I DIDN'T -- I THINK IT WAS 64% OF THE DOMINANTLY BLACK WARDS IN 1991, TO KEEP ELECTED WARD WAS 57% IN 1996. ALSO EAST BOSTON, CHARLESTOWN ALSO WERE ARE COMMUNITIES THAT

THAT NARRATIVE THAT THE CITY

DEMOCRACY IS MESSY.

AS A 2016 REMINDS US A LOT CAN GO WRONG.
IS WRONG.
I THANK YOU FOR HOLDING THIS HEARING AND I LOOK FORWARD TO FURTHER CONVERSATIONS ABOUT HOW WE CAN MAKE IT RIGHT.
THANK YOU THANK YOU, MARY AND THANK YOU TO ALL EVER YOU YOU FOR YOUR TESTIMONY THIS EVENING. I'M GOING TO OPEN UP FOR QUESTIONS FROM MY COLLEAGUES. COUNCILOR O'MALLEY.

YES, DEMOCRACY IS MESSY BUT ALLOWS FOR THAT DIRECT REPRESENTATION F. WE WERE TO SUGGEST THERE'S NO POLITICS IN THE CURRENT STRUCTURE WE'RE NOT BEING HONEST.

TO OPEN THAT UP I FIRMLY BELIEVE WE OUGHT TO BE EXPLORING AND MOVING TO.

MY QUESTION IS, ANYONE CAN JUMP IN OR EVERYONE JUST WEIGH IN I SORT OF HEARD LOUDLY AND CLEARLY A LOT OF SUPPORT FROM THIS PANEL ON HAVING A SIMILAR STRUCTURE TO THE 1983 VERSION, WHICH WOULD BE FOUR AT-LARGE CITY WIDE ELECTED. ANALOGOUS WITH THE COUNCIL DISTRICTS.

ANY THOUGHT ON SORT OF WHAT I'VE BEEN TALKING ABOUT WITH THIS HYBRID APPROACH WHICH OTHER CITIES HAVE DONE, WASHINGTON, D.C. MAY HAVE CHANGED BACK. HAVING SOME ELECTED AND SOME APPOINTED DOES ANYONE SORT OF WANT TO WEIGH IN ON THOUGHTS OF THAT?

>> COUNCILOR O'MALLEY, I ACTUALLY WANT TO BE VERY CLEAR AS RELATES TO NAACP BOSTON BRANCH AT THIS POINT IN TIME. WE HAVE NOT FORMALLY COME OUT IN SUPPORT OF ANY DICK GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE. BUT WHERE WE ARE FIRMLY POSITIONED IS IN A BELIEF THAT WHEN IT COMES TO THE RELINQUISHMENT OF THE RIGHT TO VOTE FOR SCHOOL COMMITTEE REPRESENTATION UNDERSTAND CITY OF BOSTON, THAT IT IS HIGH TIME FOR US TO REVISIT THAT DECISION. ANY TIME WE EITHER RELINQUISH VOLUNTARILY OR WE ARE STRIPPED OF OUR RIGHT TO VOTE IN THIS COUNTRY, IT SHOULD ONLY BE AN EXTREME CIRCUMSTANCES WHEN THERE IS NO OTHER ALTERNATIVE. SO WHILE THERE MAY HAVE BEEN CONDITIONS IN 1989 AND 1996 THAT LID THE CITY TO BELIEVE THAT WE HAD NO OTHER ALTERNATIVE BUT TO GO FORWARD WITH AN ELECTED -- AN APPOINTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE, OUR POSITION IS THAT THE TIME IS NOW FOR US TO HAVE AN OPEN, TRANSPARENT CONVERSATION AS A CITY ABOUT WHAT IS THE BEST GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE FOR OUR SCHOOL COMMITTEE THAT WILL LEAD TO THE ACADEMIC OUTCOME THAT WE ALL WANT TO SEE FOR OUR CHILDREN. IN DEEP CONVERSATION IN THE CONDITION THAT LED TO THE DECISION TO MOVE TOWARD AN APPOINTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE. SPECIFICALLY, WHAT WE BELIEVE WE NEED TO HAVE A BETTER UNDERSTANDING OF IS WHETHER AN APPOINTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE HAS ACTUALLY DONNED JOB IT WAS SET **OUT -- THAT WE BELIEVED IT WAS** GOING TO DO. THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE MAKES THE

ABOUT WHETHER WE SHOULD CONTINUE
TO HAVE.

>> THANK YOU, MADAM PRESIDENT, APPRECIATE THAT CONTEXT. DID ANYONE ELSE WANT TO WEIGH EN ENON SORT OF THE HYBRID MODEL OF THOUGHTS.

>> I WANT TO ECHO WHAT WAS SAID. HOWEVER WE BELIEVE THAT IN ORDER TO HAVE TRUE INPUT AND INCLUSIVE AND TRANSPARENT PROCESS. ALSO IN TRUST IN PARENTS THAT MUST BE A BALANCE OF POWER IN THE DECISION MAKING PROCESS. RIGHT NOW BPS CONTINUES TO STRUGGLE WITH FAMILY AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT. IT'S ALWAYS BEEN AN ISSUE. ONE OF THE THINGS IS BUILDING TRUST AND PARENTS BEING INVOLVED IN HAVING THE POWER OF THEIR VOICES HEARD BEING PART OF THE DECISIONS THAT ARE BEING MADE AND NOT BEING MADE SHROUDED IN

SECRECY. WE CAN INCLUDE THE ASSIGNMENT OF THE APPOINTMENT OF THE INTERIM SUPERINTENDENT, THE BILL BPS ISSUE, NUMBER OF ISSUES HAVE BEEN MADE AND PARENTS FEEL THAT EVEN KNOW FORUMS AND MEETINGS ARE HELD THAT'S JUST FOR CHECKING THE BOX, THIS THEIR VOICES ARE NOT HEARD. THAT THEIR INPUT IS NOT IN INCLUDED, THAT THEY ARE NOT PART OF THE DECISION-MAKING PROCESS. SO. FROM THE POSITION OF -- WE STRONGLY BELIEVE THAT WE NEED TO GO BACK TO AN ELECTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE SO THAT WE CAN HAVE

CLEAR REPRESENTATION AND PARENTS HAVE A VOICE, THEY HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO SPEAK TO REPRESENTATIVES WHO HAVE THEIR PRIORITIES AND INTERESTS IN MIND AND THEY CAN CONNECT AND SPEAK WITH THEM IN AN OPEN AND TRANSPARENT WAY.
WE DEFINITELY ARE FOR ELECTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE.

>> I JUST WANTED TO ASK THAT --I THINK IN AN EFFORT. THE MAYORAL CONTROL IS THE REAL SITUATION THAT HINDERS THE DEMOCRATIC PROCESS SO WITH HYBRID MODEL YOU STILL HAVE MAYORAL CONTROL IN APPOINTMENTS AND IN DECISIONS. CURRENTLY WITH WEST ROXBURY COMPLEX DECISION THAT IS GOING TO BE HAPPENING DECEMBER 19th HOPE Y'ALL ARE ABLE TO MAKE IT. AND SUPPORT CHILDREN AND FAMILIES TRYING TO KEEP THEIR SCHOOL OPEN AND KEEP THEIR EDUCATION. THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE ASKED REALLY HARD QUESTIONS TO BPS THEY MADE COMMENTS ABOUT HOW SOME OF THE INFORMATION THAT THEY HAVE GIVEN THEM DOESN'T FEEL RIGHT AND HOW THEY HAVE BEEN IN THEIR EDUCATIONAL PROFESSIONALS AND NUMBERS DON'T ADD UP SO THEY THEMSELVES HAVE DISTRUST OF BPS. >> THANK YOU, COUNCILOR O' O'MALLEY. COUNCILOR EDWARDS.

>> THANK YOU SO MUCH FOR YOUR TESTIMONY. I REALLY THINK THIS CONTEXT GETTING IN TO THE DETAILS ABOUT HISTORY OF RACIALLIZED HISTORY WHICH WAS USED TO JUSTIFY APPOINTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE, REALLY HELPS TO UNDERSTAND THAT IN REALITY THERE ARE MANY, MANY LEVELS TO THIS CONVERSATION AND THAT THE FACT THAT SOME OF THE ARDENT SUPPORTERS OF AN ELECTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE HAVE BEEN AFRICAN AMERICANS THROUGHOUT THE ENTIRE DISCOURSE IS EXTREMELY IMPORTANT. I REALLY APPRECIATE AND WANT TO THANK YOU FOR HIGHLIGHTING THAT. ANYONE CAN ANSWER THESE QUESTIONS AS THEY COME UP, AS I PRESENT THEM. THE NEW DEMOGRAPHICS OF THE CITY COUNCIL, THE VOTERS IN BOSTON ARE DEMONSTRATING AILINGNESS TO CONSIDER TO LOOK AT AND TO MOVE IN A DIFFERENT WAY, I THINK IT'S WORTH CAPTURING THAT ENERGY IN LOOKING HOW WE GOVERN OUR SCHOOLS.

I WOULD ENCOURAGE, BECAUSE I THINK THIS CONVERSATION IS JUST BEGINNING AND WILL ONLY GET MORE INTENSE IN A GOOD WAY THAT ADVOCATES I'D LOVE FOR YOU TO, WHEN YOU COME BACK, I READ IT, IT'S INCREDIBLE.

WHEN YOU COME BACK AND TALK ABOUT THINGS WE NEED TO CO CONSIDER, ABOUT MESSY DEMOCRACY AND HOW IN THE CREATIVE AND AMAZING MIND SPACE THAT WE HAVE HOW WE CAN ACCOUNT FOR THAT AND PROTECT DEMOCRACY.

I WOULD LOVE FOR YOU TO LOOK AT THINGS SUCH AS HOW WE'RE DOING REDISTRICTING, HOW THAT COULD LOOK LIKE FOR SCHOOL COMMITTEE, DRAWING DISTRICT LINES.

TERM LIMITS ARE SOMETHING THAT IS WORTH, I DON'T KNOW, IN YOUR ANALYSIS IF IT DOES MAKE US MORE DEMOCRATIC OR NOT.

WHAT MAKES SOMEONE QUALIFIED TO RUN FOR SCHOOL COMMITTEE. SHOULD IT BE AS SOMEONE ELOQUENTLY QUOTED, CLOSEST TO THE PAIN, SHOULD BE CLOSEST TO THE POWER.

IS THAT ALWAYS A BAD THING THAT THIS IS TRAINING GROUND SOME OF THE MOST ACTIVELY INVOLVED INDIVIDUALS I'LL SAY THIS, THERE'S STILL GENDER EQUITY ISSUE. I'LL JUST PUT THAT OUT THERE. CURRENTLY THERE'S ALSO A SUPERINTENDENT SEARCH THAT MANY OF US CONTRIBUTED TO A STATEMENT WHERE WE ASKED FOR AN EDUCATIONAL LEADER AND WE WANT THAT TO BE THE FOCUS OF THE SEARCH. SOMEONE WHO IS A VISIONARY, SOMEONE WHO BELIEVES IN PUBLIC EDUCATION, A CHAMPION OF PUBLIC EDUCATION. WE DON'T WANT A MANAGER, WE DON'T WANT FISCAL MANAGER EVERYBODY DON'T WANT SOMEONE WHO IS DIGITALLY LITERAL, AN EDUCATIONAL POWER HOUSE. THEN I THINK THE OTHER TWO ISSUES ARE, HOUSING AND GENTRIFICATION. AND THIS IS MORE ALONG THE LINES OF THE CITY COUNCIL'S WORK AS WELL IS JUST THINKING ABOUT OV OVERDEVELOPMENT IN THE CITY AND HOW MANY, MANY FAMILIES ARE BEING PUSHED OUT BECAUSE OF RENTAL COSTS AND INABILITY TO PAY FOR THOSE SKYROCKETING RENTAL COST AND BUDGETING AT THE CITY COUNCIL LEVEL. AT THE LAST SCHOOL COMMITTEE MEETING ON SEPTEMBER 5th, IT WAS NOT CLEARLY DELINEATED. FOR EXAMPLE, THERE ARE 60 STUDENTS IN THE OUGHTISM PROGRAM AT WEST ROXBURY EDUCATIONAL COMPLEX THERE'S NO REAL PLAN IN TERMS OF WHAT IS GOING TO HAPPEN WITH THEM.
WE BELIEVE THAT THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE NEEDS TO HAVE A

COMMITTEE NEEDS TO HAVE A
MORATORIUM ON THE SCHOOL
CLOSINGS UNTIL THEY HAVE A CLEAR
PLAN OF WHAT IS GOING TO HAPPEN
WITH THOSE STUDENTS THAT IS
CLEARLY LAID OUT TO THE PARENTS.
WE ALSO BELIEVE THAT INPUT FROM
THE COMMUNITY IS NOT BEING
LISTENED TO BY THE SCHOOL
COMMITTEE.

FOR EXAMPLE, THEY VOTED ON A JOB DESCRIPTION, DOES NOT HAVE THREE TOP PRIORITIES THAT THE COMMUNITY PROVIDED.
THEY CONTINUE TO HAVE LISTENING

THEY CONTINUE TO HAVE LISTENING SESSIONS AND THEY'RE NOT FOLDING IN THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE COMMUNITY.

WE BELIEVE THAT, YES, THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE MEMBERS NEED TO DO THEIR JOB.

THEY NEED TO LISTEN TO THE COMMUNITY AND THEY NEED TO TAKE THE INPUT AND CLEARLY LISTEN TO IT AND INTEGRATE THAT INPUT IN PROVIDING PARENTS.

MORE THAN THAT, NEED TO HAVE DIALOGUE OF WHAT IS HAPPENING IN THE SCHOOLS BECAUSE PARENTS ARE NOT CLEAR AND THERE'S NOT CLEARLY LAID OUT PLAN IN TERMS

OF WHAT ARE THE NEXT STEPS ON HEALS OF SCHOOL CLOSURE, SUPERINTENDENT SEARCH, JOB DESCRIPTION.
THERE'S A LOT OF WORK THAT NEEDS TO BE DONE WITH THESE HOT BUTTON ISSUES THAT ARE CLEARLY DISRUPTING A LOT OF THE LIVES OF THE PARENTS RIGHT NOW.

SPECIFIC SUGGESTION TO DO -THEM TO DO WHAT YOU HAVE DONE.
IN OTHER WORDS, HAVE US COME UP
HERE AND SPEAK AS AN OFFICIAL
PANEL INSTEAD OF, RUBY AND I
LITERALLY AFTER MIDNIGHT WHEN WE
TESTIFIED ON WEDNESDAY NIGHT.
THEN YOU DON'T GET ANY FEEDBACK,
GIVE AND TAKE, YOU READ YOUR
STATEMENT, THEY CUT YOU OFF,
YOU'RE GONE.

>> I APPRECIATE THAT BECAUSE I HAVE THAT SAME EXPERIENCE WHEN I TESTIFY BEFORE SCHOOL COMMITTEE.

I'M NOT SURE WE COULD ASK THE
SCHOOL COMMITTEE TO DO NOW
BECAUSE THAT'S IT'S SUCH A
STRICT BODY.
TO TRY TO TRANSFORM THAT RIGHT
NOW WOULD BE VERY DIFFICULT.
I DO THINK -- HOW TO CHANGE TH
THAT, I DON'T KNOW WHAT WE COULD
DO NOW THAT WOULD CHANGE THE
FACT THAT IF THE CURRENT
CONFIGURATION WE'VE HAD TWO
DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE

INVESTIGATIONS INTO BPS FOR SERIOUS FINDINGS ABOUT OUR NONCOMPLIANCE WITH PROVIDING CHILDREN WITH FEDERAL LEHMAN DATED MINUTES REGARDING ESL INSTRUCTION TO THEN ONLY HAVE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE RETURN AND FIND THAT THERE WAS NOT COMPLIANCE.

I DON'T KNOW WHAT RIGHT NOW WE COULD DO TO MAKE THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE MORE ACCOUNTABLE TO THAT.

THE FACT THAT BEFORE OUR LAST MAYORAL ELECTION ONE OF OUR CHILDREN IN EAST BOSTON WAS PULLED OUT OF SCHOOL AND SET FOR DEPORTATION FOR AN ARGUMENT IN A SCHOOL CAFETERIA.

I DIDN'T EXPECT FOR A CITY TO DECIDE THAT, THAT WAS JUST THE MAYOR'S FAULT HOLD HIM ACCOUNTABLE FOR THAT.

NEVERTHELESS, THERE WAS REALLY NO ONE HELD ACCOUNTABLE FOR TH THAT.

THAT POLICY DECISION.
A DECISION THAT CAME FROM A
POLICY DECIDING TO SHARE
INFORMATION WITH FEDERAL AGENTS,
I DON'T KNOW WHAT RIGHT NOW THE
CURRENT STRUCTURE WOULD REALLY

ALLOW FOR.
HOWEVER, IF I COULD MAKE A
RECOMMENDATION ABOUT THE CITY
COUNCIL, MAYBE HOW THE CITY

COUNCIL COULD BE MORE HELPFUL IN THIS ENDEAVOR AS WE TRY TO GET TO A MORE EQUITABLE EDUCATION

FOR OUR CHILDREN.

I THINK ONE WOULD BE MORE AUDITING ON THE BUDGET SORT OF AFTER THE FISCAL YEAR HAS COME TO AN END TO LOOK FOR HOW MONIES WERE SPENT AND HOW EFFECTIVE OR EFFICIENT THOSE ENDEAVORS WERE TO FURTHERING EDUCATION OF CHILDREN.

I ALSO THINK THERE'S AN
OPPORTUNITY FOR PRO-ACTIVELY
DECIDING HOW WE WOULD LIKE AS A
CITY OUR COMMUNITY-BASED CREDIT
TO BE SPENT BY NONPROFIT
PARTNERS AROUND THE CITY WILL

GET TENS OF MILLIONS OF DOLLARS IN CBCs ARE NOT ALLOWED TO SPEND THOSE WITHOUT ANY DIRECTION I THINK REALLY FROM CITIZENS HOW THEY SHOULD BE SPENT

SPENT. I THINK THAT MIGHT BE AN INTERESTING WAY TO SAY COULD WE DO MORE WITH WHAT WE'RE GETTING IF WE'RE GOING TO ALLOW COLLEGE TO CLAIM \$3 MILLION OF COMMUNITY-BASED CREDIT MAYBE MILLION DOLLARS TO GO TO AFTER SCHOOL TUTORING OR WHATEVER IT IS. SET THOSE GUIDELINES. THE COURAGE QUITE FRANKLY THAT YOU'RE EXHIBITING NOW THIS BODY IS EXHIBITING NOW ENGAGE IN THIS DIALOGUE, THAT'S ALL WE NEED TO GET THIS CONVERSATION STARTED AND TO CONTINUE DOING WHAT WE'RE DOING HERE TODAY AND TO HAVE THESE WONDERFUL PEOPLE CONTINUE TO SHOW UP AND LEND THEIR EXPERTISE TO YOU. SO I WOULD SHARE WITH YOU, I WOULD SHARE WITH YOU COUNCILOR THAT YOU HAVE ALL OF THE EXPERTISE THAT YOU NEED TO MAKE SOME GREAT, INFORMED DECISIONS ON THIS.

AND UNTIL A CHANGE, YOU CAN
CONTINUE TO COUNT ON US TO HOLD
PEOPLE AS ACCOUNTABLE AS WE CAN
TO THESE THINGS, THAT INCLUDES
THE CURRENT STRUCTURE AND
MEMBERS OF THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE,
WHO I DON'T -- MAKE SURE WE
DON'T DEMONIZE.

BECAUSE THEY HAVE BEEN APPOINTED AND I DO BELIEVE, I'VE SEEN THEM GO FROM MEETING TO MEETING AND BE EXHAUSTED AND BE TIRED AND LISTEN AND I KNOW THAT THAT IS TAXING ON THE BODY EMOTIONALLY. I KNOW THEY'RE TRYING TO DO WHAT THEY CAN.

MAKE THAT CLEAR. ANY ADDITIONAL QUESTIONS, THANK YOU. YOU ALL ARE WELCOME TO CERTAINLY

STAY, FEW MORE MEMBERS THAT WANT TO GIVE PUBLIC TESTIMONY WHICH

I'D LIKE TO GET TO THAT.

WHILE YOU ARE CLEARING OUT,

THANK YOU VERY MUCH. WE WILL NOT BE HERE AS THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE. I JOKE THAT I CAN GO FROM SCHOOL COMMITTEE MEETINGS AND TESTIFYING EARLY ON WHICH I HAVE THE GREAT LIBERTY TO DO, THEN GOING TO ANOTHER COMMUNITY MEETING OR EVENT THEN GOING HOME AND WATCHING THE END OF THE MEETING WHILE FOLDING LAUNDRY. >> I'LL GO FAST. MY NAME IS CHRISTINE, I AM DORCHESTER RESIDENT. MY INVOLVEMENT WITH THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS STRETCHES BACK 60 YEARS TO 1958 WHEN I STARTED KINDERGARTEN AT THE PJ KENNEDY SCHOOL IN EAST BOSTON. I ATTENDED SCHOOL UNDER ELECTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE ALSO BEGAN MY CAREER IN BPS DURING ELECTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE, MY OWN THREE KIDS ATTENDED WHEN IT WAS APPOINTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE WHEN I RETIRED AFTER 36 YEARS STILL UNDER THE APPOINTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE. I'M HERE TODAY TO SPEAK IN FAVOR OF ELECTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE. ONE OBJECTION MANY MAKE TO

ELECTED BOARD IT WILL BECOME POLITICAL.

I WOULD SUBMIT THAT THE BOARD ALREADY POLITICAL JUST THAT THE POLITICS REPRESENTED ARE THOSE OF ONE PERSON.

IN A DEMOCRACY VOICE OF THOSE WHO PAY TAXES MUST BE

REPRESENTED.

IT DOESN'T WORK THAT WAY CURRENTLY.

UNDER MAYOR MENINO PRIORITIES 98 98% OF THE TIME.

UNDER MAYOR WALSH RECENTLY SEEN ONE SUPERINTENDENT SUMMARILY DISMISSED ANOTHER HIRED WITHOUT EVEN PRETEXT OF SCHOOL COMMITTEE VOTE.

ANOTHER COMMON OBJECTION THE LAST ELECTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE WAS DISASTER.

WE RUN THE RISK THAT SOMETIMES MAKE BAD CHOICES AS -- BAD DECISION MAKING IN DEMOCRACY ISN'T LESS PARTICIPATION IT'S MORE.

ALSO THE APPOINTED SCHOOL COMMITTEE HASN'T EXACTLY ALWAYS INSPIRED CONFIDENCE.

IN DECEMBER OF 2010 BEGAN DURING ROUND OF RECOMMENDED SCHOOL CLOSURES, ONE MEMBER NAME REDACTED AS REPORTED BY BOSTON GLOBE ON DECEMBER 16th, 2010. QUOTE, WHEN I NEED A COMMENT FROM A WHITE PRIVILEGED KID LIKE YOU I'LL LET YOU KNOW.

END QUOTE FROM THE MEMBER.
THE MAN WHO APPEARED TO BE IN
HIS 20s WAS THE MAN WHO WAS
DIRECTED HAD TATTOOS ON HIS NECK
AND ARMS YELLED BACK THAT HE WAS
UNEMPLOYED AS HE VOICED HIS OUTS
RAGE OVER THE COMMENT.

A PREGNANT TEACHER LEADS TO THE MAN'S DEFENSE SHE YELLED FROM HER SEAT AT THE MEMBER WHO WAS ON THE STAGE, THAT PROMPTED A CALL, REPEATED CALL FOR SECURITY TO REMOVE THE PREGNANT TEACHER, SHE LEFT ON HER OWN.
PERHAPS THIS MEMBER WOULD HAVE

PERHAPS THIS MEMBER WOULD HAVE BEEN MORE RESTRAINED IN HIS REMARKS HAD HE KNOWN HE WAS GOING TO STAND FOR RE-ELECTION. MORE RECENTLY OCTOBER SCHOOL **COMMITTEE MEETING WITH SOME 58** INDIVIDUALS GAVE EMOTIONAL TESTIMONY AGAINST CLOSING OF THE WEST ROXBURY COMPLEX WHILE PARENTS, TEACHERS AND STUDENTS START TO ENGAGE THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE MEMBERS, ONE MEMBER SEATED ON THE DIAS TWEETING ABOUT TOTALLY UNRELATED TO THE SITUATION UNFOLDING BEFORE HIM. IT IS DIFFICULT TO FEEL CONFIDENT THAT HIS FULL ATTENTION WAS DIRECTED TO THOSE BEFORE HIM BUT HOW MIGHT WE HAVE HELD HIM ACCOUNTABLE FOR HIS ACTION? CURRENTLY THE COMPOSITION OF

CURRENTLY THE COMPOSITION OF BOSTON SCHOOL COMMITTEE LOOKS LIKE THAT OF TRUSTEES OF MASSACHUSETTS CHARTER SCHOOLS WITH SOME 31% OF THE TRUSTEES COME FROM THE CORPORATE WORLD AND LITTLE PARENT RE REPRESENTATION.

IT'S WORTH POINTING OUT THAT
THERE ARE NO K-12 TEACHERS
SERVING ON SCHOOL COMMITTEE.
THAT SEEMS TO BE CONSIDERED A
LACK, CONFLICT OF INTEREST
RATHER THAN PERTINENT
EXPERIENCE.

LASTLY BOSTON IS ONLY ONE OF MASSACHUSETTS 351 TOWNS, WE HAVE LARGEST AND MOST COMPLEX SCHOOL SYSTEM IN THE STATE AND WIDE RANGE OF VIEWPOINTS NECESSARY TO SUPPORT OUR SCHOOLS.
WHAT IS THE RATIONAL FOR

DEPRIVING SOME 700,000 RESIDENTS OF THE REPRESENTATION THAT ALL OTHER COMMUNITIES IN THE STATE ENJOY.

BECAUSE SCHOOL COMMITTEES, WEALTHY PRIVATIZERS ARE DETERMINED TO UNDERMINE SCHOOL BOARDS ACROSS THE COUNTRY. FOR EXAMPLE, IN KEYNOTE SPEECH AT THE CALIFORNIA CHARTER SCHOOLS ASSOCIATION ON MARCH 4th, 2014, REED HASTINGS THE CEO OF NETFLIX ADVOCATED FOR ELIMINATION OF SCHOOL BOARDS.

SPEAKING FAVORABLY OF CHARTER SCHOOLS HE SAID, MOST IMPORTANT THING THAT THEY CONSTANTLY GET BETTER EVERY YEAR.

THEY ARE GETTING BETTER BECAUSE THEY HAVE STABLE GOVERNANCE THEY

DON'T HAVE AN ELECTED SCHOOL

BOARD THAT'S REAL TOUGH ISSUE.

NOW IF WE GO TO THE GENERAL

PUBLIC AND WE SAY, HERE IS

ARGUMENT WITH WHY YOU SHOULD GET

RID OF SCHOOL BOARDS, NO ONE IS

GOING FOR THAT.

SCHOOL BOARDS HAVE BEEN ICONIC PART OF AMERICA FOR MORE THAN 20 200 YEARS.

I DO HAVE ONE CAVEAT WHICH WAS RAISED TONIGHT IN THE PURSUIT OF ELECTED SCHOOL PERIOD.

WE MUST KEEP OUT A WEARY EYE FOR DARK MONEY.

IN 2017, \$15 MILLION WAS SPENT ON LOS ANGELES SCHOOL BOARD ELECTION.

REED HASTINGS THE CEO OF NETFLIX CONTRIBUTED \$7 MILLION, DARK MONEY, DIFFICULT TO TRACE. GOAL WAS TO ELECT CHARTER

FRIENDLY SCHOOL BOARD.

WHICH THEY DID.

BOARD HAS JUST NAMED HEDGE FUND MANAGER AND BANKER A PERSON WITH NO RELEVANT EDUCATIONAL EXPERIENCE TO WORK AS SUPERINTENDENT.

SOMETHING WE NEED TO KEEP FOCUSED ON.
TO ACHIEVE AR FLECTED SCHOOL
