The Slow Streets program addresses pressing street safety concerns by emphasizing quick-install solutions. These may include:

- Signs to alert drivers they are entering a residential area with a 20 mph speed limit
- Better crosswalks
- Speed humps to slow drivers
- Parking restrictions at some corners so drivers can better see pedestrians and oncoming traffic when turning. This is called "daylighting"
- Changes to street direction on narrow streets
- Changes to design of curbs or medians to slow drivers and make streets safer for crossing
