ORDER FOR A HEARING ON THE PROPOSED NORTH-SOUTH RAIL LINK

- WHEREAS, Massachusetts ranks 47th in the nation for longest commute times and 42nd in the nation for transportation infrastructure quality; and
- WHEREAS, Boston area drivers lose an average of 164 hours each year sitting in traffic, the most in the nation; and
- WHEREAS, The Massachusetts Commuter Rail system is effectively split between the North and South of Boston, preventing statewide connectivity and mobility; and
- WHEREAS, A fragmented region squanders the potential of Massachusetts' existing transportation infrastructure and hobbles the regional economy; and
- WHEREAS, Boston is the single gap in continuous service between Amtrak's Northeast Corridor, which runs from Washington D.C. to Boston, and Amtrak's Downeaster, which runs from Brunswick, Maine to Boston; and
- WHEREAS, Connecting North and South Station in Boston, a project known as the North-South Rail Link, would unify Massachusetts' regional rail system and provide the much-needed connectivity for the region, state, and the Northeast as a whole; and
- WHEREAS, Every member of the Boston City Council has endorsed and are members of the North-South Rail Link Working Group; and
- WHEREAS, A MassDOT hearing on November 19, 2018, regarding the North-South Rail Link project, saw strong support of the project from the public, rail and transit activists, and elected officials. THEREFORE BE IT
- ORDERED, That the appropriate committee of the Boston City Council hold a hearing to examine the benefits and cost analysis of the North-South Rail Link project for improvement of transportation in the Greater Boston area.
